

EMERGENCY ORDER NO. 2019- 10

**AN EMERGENCY ORDER EXTENDING A STATE OF LOCAL EMERGENCY AS PROVIDED BY PART I, CHAPTER 252, FLORIDA STATUTES AND BY ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA ORDINANCE NO. 2019-40**

WHEREAS, a state of local emergency was declared through St. Johns County Emergency Order 2019-1, as authorized by PART I, CHAPTER 252, FLORIDA STATUTES AND BY ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA ORDINANCE NO. 2019-40 because of the severe threat and the potential of Hurricane Dorian to create excessive rainfall, high tides and hurricane force winds, which posed a serious threat to public health and safety and cause flooding, beach erosion, and property damage; and

WHEREAS, storm and/or post-storm emergency conditions still exist in portions of St. Johns County:

NOW THEREFORE, in accordance with the emergency power vested in the County pursuant to Chapter 252, Florida Statutes, and St. Johns County Ordinance No. 2019-40, it is hereby declared that: (1) the state of local emergency declared through St. Johns County Emergency Order 2019-1 is still in effect, and (2) all emergency powers authorized through St. Johns County Emergency Order 2019-1 are continued for a period of seven (7) days.
