

ORDINANCE NUMBER: 76-23

INTRODUCED BY: COMMISSIONER CURTAN

AN EMERGENCY ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE
NO. 76-20 DEFINING, CLARIFYING AND REGULATING CONTRACTORS AND THE BUSINESS OF CONTRACTING.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by four members of the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, that an emergency exists and that to require contractors liability and completed operations insurance will work an extreme hardship on all contractors and possibly prevent them from continuing business due to the difficulty of obtaining such insurance.

NOW, THEREFORE, this Commission determines that an emergency exists and that immediate enactment of this ordinance is necessary.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. That this Board determines that an emergency exists and waives notice of requirements and determines that the immediate enactment of this ordinance is necessary.


Section 2. That Section IV B, Bond requirement, paragraph two, be amended to read as follows:

As a further requirement, the applicant shall furnish the County Building Inspector's Office evidence that such applicant is carrying a policy of Workman's Compensation Insurance as required by law. Contractors Liability Insurance with respect to such business through an insurance company authorized to do business in the State of Florida, for an amount not less than \$50,000 for one person, \$100,000 for one accident, and \$25,000 policy of property damage insurance with respect to such business. If such insurance expires, or is at any time cancelled, during the term of this certificate, then the certificate issued to the insured shall be immediately and automatically suspended and it shall be unlawful thereafter for the Contractor/Special Trades Contractor to engage in such business until such certificate is reinstated. No new bond or new certificate shall be required as long as the original bond and insurance remains sufficient and in full force and effect.


Section 3. This is an emergency ordinance enacted under Section 125.66, Florida Statutes, Subparagraph 3, and shall take effect when a copy has been accepted by the postal authorities of the government of the United States for special delivery by registered mail to the Department of State of the State of Florida.

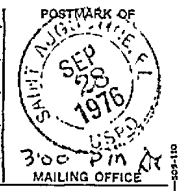
