

ORDINANCE NUMBER 78 - 31

INTRODUCED BY: COMMISSIONER BENET

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ST. JOHNS, STATE OF FLORIDA, REGULATING TRAFFIC PATTERN AND FLOW OF TRAFFIC ON THE BEACHES BORDERING THE ATLANTIC OCEAN BETWEEN HIGH AND LOW WATER MARKS BY PROVIDING FOR ONE WAY TRAFFIC SOUTHERLY ONLY BETWEEN THE SOUTH LIMITS OF THE TOWN OF ST. AUGUSTINE BEACH, FLORIDA AND THE CRESCENT BEACH RAMP IN ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA; AND PROVIDING FOR EFFECTIVE TIMES AND DATES FOR THE ONE WAY TRAFFIC FROM APRIL 15TH THROUGH SEPTEMBER 15TH OF EACH YEAR FROM 9:00 A.M. TO 6:00 P.M. ON SATURDAYS, SUNDAYS AND STATE LEGAL HOLIDAYS; PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE FOR THE ORDINANCE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1: The flow of motor powered vehicle traffic on the beach bordering the Atlantic Ocean between high and low water marks from the south limits of the Town of St. Augustine Beach, Florida to the Crescent Beach Ramp in St. Johns County, Florida is hereby designated as one-way traffic traveling southerly only, between April 15th and September 15th of each year on Saturdays, Sundays and State legal holidays, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on said days.

Section 2: The effective time for enforcement of this ordinance shall be between April 15th and September 15th of each year, between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. on Saturdays, Sundays and State legal holidays.

Section 3: This ordinance is enacted under the provisions of the Laws of the State of Florida and Chapter 21543, Special Acts of Florida 1941.

Section 4: Any person, firm or corporation found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be punishable as provided by the State of Florida Uniform Traffic Control Law and Chapter 318, Florida Statutes.

Section 5: This ordinance shall take effect at 1:00 o'clock a.m. on Wednesday, May 17, 1978.
