

ORDINANCE NO. 80-37
INTRODUCED BY: COMMISSIONER CURTAN

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ST. JOHNS,
STATE OF FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR AN ELEC-
TION TO CONSIDER EXPANSION OF THE ANASTASIA
MOSQUITO CONTROL DISTRICT TO INCLUDE PRE-
CINCT 17

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Anastasia
Mosquito Control District has received petitions signed by more
than 15 percent of the registered electors who reside within the
area known as Precinct 17 in St. Johns County, Florida, described
and bounded as follows:

Beginning at the intersection of Interstate
Highway 95 and State Road 207; thence north-
easterly along State Road 207 to Moultrie
Creek; thence southeasterly and easterly
following the course of said Moultrie Creek
to U. S. Highway 1; thence northerly along
U.S. Highway 1 to the southerly limits for
the City of St. Augustine; thence easterly,
southerly and easterly along the southerly
limits for the City of St. Augustine to the
run of Matanzas River; thence southerly
along the run of Matanzas River to State
Road 206; thence westerly along State Road
206 to Interstate Highway 95; thence north-
westerly along Interstate Highway 95 to the
point of beginning,

suggesting that the Board of Commissioners of Anastasia Mosquito
Control District in accordance with Section 388.211, Florida
Statutes, file a petition with the Board of County Commissioners
of St. Johns County, Florida, requesting said Board to call an
election of the qualified voters of the above described territory
to determine whether or not the boundaries of Anastasia Mosquito
Control District, St. Johns County, Florida, shall be extended
to include the lands within the above described territory; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners of Anastasia Mosquito
Control District has filed its Petition requesting that election
be held of the registered voters residing within the existing
district and the district requesting to be annexed, and the Board

of Commissioners of St. Johns County finds that the statements contained in said Petition are true. Be it ordained by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida:

SECTION 1. It is ordered that there be held an election of the registered electors residing within the existing district, and the registered electors residing within the district requesting to be annexed, to determine by the majority of votes cast in the existing district, and by the majority of votes cast in the district requesting to be annexed, whether the boundary of the district will be changed.

SECTION 2. The date of said election is fixed to be concurrent with the general election to be held in November of 1980.

SECTION 3. The Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners is directed to cause a notice of such election to be published once each week for four consecutive weeks in a newspaper of general circulation published in St. Johns County, Florida, including in such notice a description of the territory proposed to be added to the district.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of official acknowledgment from the office of the Secretary of State to the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida that same has been filed.
