

ORDINANCE NUMBER: 86-44

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ST. JOHNS, STATE OF FLORIDA, AMENDING ST. JOHNS COUNTY ORDINANCE 84-61 WHICH IS THE ORDINANCE REQUIRING DOGS TO BE ON LEASHES IN CERTAIN SUBDIVISIONS WITHIN THE COUNTY; THIS AMENDMENT CLARIFIES THAT THE COUNTY ANIMAL CONTROL OFFICER IS THE COUNTY OFFICIAL AUTHORIZED TO CATCH AND IMPOUND DOGS THAT ARE IN VIOLATION OF THE ORDINANCE AND PROVIDES AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. St. Johns County Ordinance No. 84-61, which is the ordinance described in the above title, is hereby amended as follows:

Section 2A is deleted and the following is added and substituted in its stead:

Section 2A. Animal Control Officer shall mean a person designated by the County Administration to control, catch and impound dogs and other animals regulated by this ordinance and/or other St. Johns County ordinances pertaining to dogs or other animals.

Section 5A is deleted and the following is added and substituted in its stead:

Section 5A. In the event any dog owner cannot be located to take custody of a loose dog, the dog may be caught by the Animal Control Officer and impounded at the St. Augustine Humane Society Shelter. All costs of confinement shall be paid by the dog's owner.

Section 2. This ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of official acknowledgment by the Office of the Secretary

of State to the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, that same has been filed.

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, AT ITS REGULAR MEETING ON MAY 27, 1986 AT 9:45 O'CLOCK A.M., IN THE COUNTY AUDITORIUM, COUNTY ADMINISTRATION BUILDING, LEWIS SPEEDWAY (COUNTY ROAD 16-A) AND U.S. #1 NORTH, ST. AUGUSTINE, FLORIDA, WILL HOLD A PUBLIC HEARING TO CONSIDER THE PASSAGE OF THE FOLLOWING ORDINANCE:

An Ordinance of the County of St. Johns, State of Florida, amending St. Johns County Ordinance 84-61 which is the ordinance requiring dogs to be on leashes in certain subdivisions within the County; THIS AMENDMENT clarifies that the County Animal Control Officer is the county official authorized to catch and impound dogs that are in violation of the ordinance and provides an effective date.

The proposed Ordinance is on file in the office of the Clerk of the Circuit Court, St. Johns County, Florida, St. Johns County Administration Building, Lewis Speedway, and may be examined by parties interested prior to said public hearing. All parties having any interest in said Ordinance will be afforded an opportunity to be heard at the public hearing.

If a person decides to appeal any decision made by the Board of County Commissioners with respect to any matter considered at the meeting or hearings, he will need a record of the proceedings, and for such purpose he may need to ensure that a verbatim record of the proceedings is made, which record includes the testimony and evidence upon which the appeal is to be based.
