ORDINANCE NO. 92-19

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ST. JOHNS, STATE OF FLORIDA AMENDING ITS ORDINANCE #86-89 TO CLARIFY THAT THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS MAY ISSUE BONDS TO REFUND OUTSTANDING BONDS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, State of Florida v. City of Miami, 19 So. 2d 790 (Fla. 1944) states that the power expressly granted to issue bonds payable from revenues includes the power to refund those bonds upon terms more favorable to the issuer; and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County ordinance 86-89, the County's home rule ordinance authorizing the County to issue bonds for capital projects, does not expressly confer authority to issue stand alone refunding bonds upon terms more favorable to the County than the terms of the outstanding bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners considers it desireable and appropriate to amend ordinance 86-89 to expressly confer such authority to issue such stand alone refunding bonds so that resort to case law for such authority is not necessary

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA that St. Johns County ordinance #86-89 is hereby amended by adding the following section thereto:

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SECTION 8. The foregoing sections shall be liberally construed and shall specifically be deemed to authorize the Board to issue stand alone bonds for the purpose of refunding outstanding bonds that were previously issued (i) for County Projects or (ii) to refund previous County bonds, when such refunding is determined by the Board to be advantageous to the County and to pay all Costs associated with such refunding from the proceeds of such refunding bonds.

EFFECTIVE DATE: This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon receipt of official acknowledgment by the Office of the Department of State to the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners that same has been filed.
