ORDINANCE NO. 2023 - 22_

AN ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF ST. JOHNS, STATE OFFLORIDA, DISSOLVING THE DEERFIELD PRESERVE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT DISTRICT PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 189 AND CHAPTER 190, FLORIDA STATUTES; REPEALING ORDINANCE NO. 2006-43; PROVIDING A DISCLAIMER OF DISTRICT OBLIGATIONS; PROVIDING A SEVERABILITY CLAUSE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, on April 18, 2006, the St. Johns County Board of Commissioners (the County) adopted Ordinance 2006-43 establishing the Deerfield Preserve Community Development District (the District); .and

WHEREAS, in a letter dated March 24, 2020, the District's registered agent notified Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) that the District has taken no action for over two years and the District has not had a sufficient number of board members to constitute a quorum for over two years; and

WHEREAS, on April 17, 2020, DEO published in the St. Augustine Record a Notice of Proposed Declaration of Inactive Status of the Deerfield Preserve Community Development District (the Notice), which required any party objecting to the proposed inactive status to file an objection with the Department within 21 days of publication of the Notice; and

WHEREAS, DEO did not receive any objections during the 21 days provided for objection to the Notice; and

WHEREAS, legal counsel for the current developer for Deerfield Preserve, DR Horton, has been contacted and has confirmed that there is no objection to dissolution of the District; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 189.062, Florida Statutes, DEO has changed the status of the District from "active" to "inactive" and has requested that the County repeal Ordinance 2006-43, which established the District, in a letter dated May 19, 2020; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Sections 189.062 and 190.046, Florida Statutes, the County is required dissolve a community development district declared inactive by DEO and repeal the enabling ordinance; and

WHEREAS; it is the intention of the County to not undertake or accept any financial obligations, operating or maintenance responsibilities, or any other obligations of the District; and

WHEREAS, the last Annual Financial Report Deerfield Preserve CDD filed with the Florida Department of Financial Services in 2017 stated there were zero revenues, zero expenditures and zero debt; and

WHEREAS, the County desires to dissolve the District, subject to the terms and conditions set forth in this Ordinance.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST.
JOHNS COUNTY:

<u>Section 1.</u> The above recitals are adopted as findings of fact in support of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 2.</u> This Ordinance is enacted pursuant to Chapter 189, Florida Statutes, Special Districts, General Provisions and Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, Community Development Districts.

<u>Section 3.</u> The Deerfield Preserve Community Development District, established by Ordinance No. 2006-43, is hereby dissolved, pursuant to the provisions of Chapter 189 and Chapter 190, Florida Statutes.

<u>Section 4.</u> Ordinance No. 2006-43, which established the Deerfield Preserve Community Development District, is hereby repealed. The Clerk is directed to place Ordinance 2006-43 into the list of repealed ordinances.

Section 5. Nothing in this Ordinance shall be construed as acceptance by St. Johns County of any financial obligations, operating or maintenance responsibilities, or any other obligation of the District.

Section 6. Notwithstanding any provision of this Ordinance, no portion of any impact fee ordinance, concurrency provision, building code, comprehensive plan or any land development regulation shall be deemed waived or varied by any provision herein. Notwithstanding any provision of this Ordinance, no portion of any use restriction, title conditions, restrictions or covenants shall be deemed waived or varied by any provision herein.

Section 7. If any provision of this Ordinance or the application thereof is finally determined by a court of competent jurisdiction to be illegal, invalid or unenforceable, such provision shall be deemed to be severable and the remaining provisions shall continue in full force and effect provided that the illegal, invalid or unenforceable provision is not material to the logical and intended interpretation of this Ordinance.

<u>Section 8.</u> This Ordinance shall take effect upon a certified copy being filed with the Florida Department of State.

Dear Chair Smith:

The Florida Department of Economic Opportunity (DEO) administers Chapter 189, Florida Statutes (the Uniform Special District Accountability Act). This act charges DEO's Special District Accountability Program with duties and responsibilities related to special districts including declaring special districts inactive under certain circumstances.

The purpose of this letter is to notify you that the Deerfield Preserve Community Development District (district), an independent special district established by St. Johns County Ordinance 2006-43, pursuant to Chapter 190, Florida Statutes, has become inactive and, pursuant to section 189.062(4), Florida Statutes, must be dissolved by the Board of County Commissioners.

In a letter dated March 24, 2020 (enclosed), Mr. Dennis E. Lyles, the district's registered agent, notified DEO that the district has taken no action for over two years and the district has not had a sufficient number of board members to constitute a quorum for over two years. When this occurs, Section 189.062, Florida Statutes, requires DEO to begin the process to declare the special district inactive. This involves publishing a notice of proposed declaration of inactive status in a newspaper of general circulation in the county in which the special district is located, requiring any party objecting to the inactive status to file an objection pursuant to Chapter 120, Florida Statutes, within 21 days after the publication date.

On April 17, 2020, DEO published the enclosed notice in the *St. Augustine Record*. On May 12, 2020, DEO determined that no objections were filed and changed the district's status from active to inactive.

Section 189.062(4), Florida Statutes, requires the entity that created a special district declared inactive to dissolve the special district by repealing its enabling laws. Accordingly, please repeal the district's establishing ordinance as amended and email documentation of that action to Jack.Gaskins@DEO.MyFlorida.com or mail it to the following address:

This letter is written in response to the recently filed lawsuit <u>State v. Deerfield Preserve</u>

<u>Community Development District</u> and follows our telephone conference regarding this CDD.

Although this CDD was established in 2006 and your office has in the past received annual reports regarding the CDD, it has not held a meeting of the Board of Supervisors since 2007. The District Manager and I have both been contacted on several occasions regarding reinstating development activities for the land within the CDD and resuming the efforts of the Board to assist in those activities but there has been no formal activity by the CDD or its Board since 2007.

This CDD has taken no action for over two years and has not had a sufficient number of Board Members to constitute a quorum for over two years.

I have recently been advised by Government Management Services that, due to the passage of time without communication from a landowner or Board Member regarding this CDD, it no longer considers itself District Manager and that it is not in a position to direct the undersigned as to any further legal action as District Counsel or Registered Agent. Accordingly, I no longer consider myself or my firm to be Registered Agent or District Counsel and I would request that your office remove my name as Registered Agent and my office as registered office.

This will also serve to notify you that I am not in possession of the name of a contact person or entity with respect to this CDD.

All local government entities are required to file an Annual Financial Report (AFR) with the Florida Department of Financial Services. According to the Local Government Financial Reporting website, Fiscal Year 2017 was the last year that the Deerfield Preserve CDD filed an AFR, reporting zero revenues, zero expenditures and zero debt (see Snippet below).

Attached is the final communication we received from the district's registered agent and attorney dated March 24, 2020. In that letter, Mr. Dennis Lyles indicates that the district has not taken any action since 2007. He may be able to provide more information (see his contact information below).

The State Board of Administration, Division of Bond Finance can verify whether the district ever issued bond debt (see contact information below).

The St. Johns County Tax Collector's may be able to help regarding whether the district ever levied debt service special assessments against real property located within the district.

The landowner may be willing to provide an affidavit regarding whether the district has any debt.

Lastly, I checked our records and we don't have any additional financial information about the district in our files. I'm not aware of any other state resources concerning special district debt. I hope this is helpful. Jack
