INTRODUCTION

The Engineers have previously met with staff and have made two presentations to the County Commission relative to needs for major near-term capital improvements to the existing Anastasia Sanitary District systems and the Mainland Water System. The Engineers have also recommended and the Commission has voted to proceed with development of an initial-phase Mainland Sewage System to serve the I95-S.R. 207 interchange and a "service corridor" along S.R. 207 northeastward to Dobbs Road.

Engineering planning efforts for the program were held in abeyance while the County advertised for and selected engineers and negotiated an engineering services agreement, all as required by the "Consultants' Competitive Negotiations Act" (F.S. 287.055). These activities culminated in St. Johns County's entering a "General Agreement for Consulting Engineering Services - Mainland Water System" with Robert Bates & Associates, Inc., dated August 11, 1987.

In the interim, Mr. J. L. Harrington, P. E., Robert Bates & Associates, Inc., has:

- (1) Met with Farmers Home Administration (Mr. Charles Nichols, District Director, Ocala) on August 14, 1987, receiving initial favorable response with respect to potential for commitment of FmHA funding for projects structured into four separate applications as indicated on the cover sheet.
- (2) Prepared "Notification of Intent" forms for forwarding to the State Planning Clearinghouse as required by Office of Management and Budget Circular A-95 as an initial step in application for Federal financial assistance. The four (4) separate forms were executed by Mr. Castle in the County's behalf and forwarded to Mr. Ron Fahs of the State of Florida Office of Planning and Budget, on August 19, 1987.
- (3) Informally discussed the program and initial steps to date with Administrative, Financial, Utilities and Legal staffs, Commissioners, and outside parties who may potentially be involved in prosecution of the programs.

The Engineers have requested this conference with responsible staffs to report and discuss actions to date; to obtain common agreements as to the content and structure of the proposed programs; and to develop personnel assignments and timetables for accomplishment of final successful FmHA financing applications.

DESCRIPTION OF PROJECTS

1. General:

The recommended programs are comprised of the projects which the Engineers consider to be the most critical system needs. To an extent the total scope of each program reflects explicit or implied guidance from Mr. Nichols to Mr. Harrington as to the magnitude of initial financial commitment which might reasonably be anticipated. In no case should these programs be considered "ultimate" solutions to utilities needs. In all cases, as growth and development in the service areas continue, additional projects will be needed to augment the systems' service capabilities. Note however that customer growth generates revenues from connection charges (to capital improvements accounts) and as "net system revenues" available to amortize additional future debt. The systems, thus, are generally planned to grow in parallel with availability of revenues or funding sources to finance costs of such further growth.

6. Summary

Estimated costs include estimated construction, technical services and contingency @ 10% \pm of estimated construction cost. Any unused contingency funds may be used for other needed improvements to the respective systems. There is also a possibility of obtaining supplemental funding once initial commitments have been made.

FINANCING

As indicated in the Introduction, initial steps have been taken to obtain financial commitments from Farmers Home Administration, U.S. Department of Agriculture - Community Facilities Loans and Grants. It is considered a certainty that all assistance for both Anastasia Sanitary District programs and the Mainland Water System program will be in the form of loans. We have been encouraged that the Mainland Wastewater System Program may be awarded grant as well as loan funds.

The interest rate charged for Community Facilities Loans is the lesser of the rates in effect at the time of: (1) funding commitment, or (2) loan closing. Rates are adjusted quarterly and are reflective of the average rates of the Municipal Bond Index. The current rate for the quarter, July 1 through September 30, 1987, is 7.25 percent, subject to adjustment October 1, 1987, and at quarterly intervals thereafter.

We believe that FmHA loan financing, to the greatest extent obtainable, is in St. Johns County's best interests because:

- (1) The interest rates compare favorably with those obtained from commercial sources.
- (2) The required debt service coverage factor (1.1 x annual principal and interest payment) is less than typically required for publicly sold or privately placed revenue bond issues. The effect is that net system revenues, gross system revenues and user charges may be less with FmHA Community Facilities Loan financing.

Typically, FmHA will require the loan applicant to obtain interim financing to pay current costs of project development until facility construction is substantially complete. At that point the Community Facilities Loan is closed and proceeds are used to repay the interim financing debt.

PROJECT TEAM

Successful pursuit and utilization of FmHA Community Facilities Loan funding requires important inputs of information and effort of various responsible parties. Affected areas of responsibility include administrative, financial, legal, technical (engineering) and interim financing. Based on the successful completion of the Anastasia Sanitary District programs in 1983-1985, it is considered prudent to keep the identical project team intact to the greatest extent possible. Consequently, it is recommended that responsibilities be assigned/delegated as follows:

Notes:

- It is suggested that the Commission by resolution authorize the filing of financial assistance applications and designate the County Administrator as "authorized representative" to execute documents in the Owner's behalf.
- (b) It is suggested that Mr. Sisco determine if contracting for services in this capacity requires public advertising, competitive selection and negotiation (per F.S. 287.055) and, if so, that the County take timely steps to complete these actions.
