RESOLUTION 87-27

REQUESTING THE FLORIDA FIRST COAST LEGISLATIVE DELEGATION TO PREPARE, SPONSOR, AND SUPPORT LEGISLATION REQUIRING LANDFILLS LOCATED WITHIN TWO (2) MILES OF AN ADJACENT COUNTY BOUNDARY TO UNDERGO DEVELOPMENT OF REGIONAL IMPACT REVIEW PURSUANT TO CHAPTER 380.06 FLORIDA STATUTES

WHEREAS, Chapter 380.06 (1) Florida Statutes defines the term "Development of Regional Impact" as any development which, because of its character, magnitude, or location, would have a substantial effect on health, safety, or welfare of citizens of more than one county; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 380.06 (2) Florida Statutes mandates the state land planning agency (Department of Community Affairs) to recommend to the Administration Commission specific statewide guidelines and standards for adoption by rule to be used in determining whether particular developments shall be required to undergo development of regional impact review; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 380.0651 (3) Florida Statutes and Chapter 27F-2, Florida Administrative Code, list those developments required to undergo development of regional impact review; and,

WHEREAS, Chapter 380.0651 (3) Florida Statutes and Chapter 27F-2 Florida Administrative Code do not define landfills as developments required to undergo development of regional impact review; and,

WHEREAS, development of landfills to be located within two (2) miles of an adjacent county boundary and would have a substantial effect upon the health, safety, or welfare of citizens of more than one county; and,

WHEREAS, the existing permitting requirements for landfills of the Department of Environmental Regulation and the Water Management District do not adequately address many of the regional impacts caused by the landfills; and,

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners hereby requests the Florida First Coast Legislative Delegation to prepare, sponsor, and support the passage of legislation which would require that landfills to be located within two (2) miles of an adjacent county boundary undergo development of regional impact review pursuant to the requirements of Chapter 380.06 Florida Statutes.
