PROCLAMATION DESIGNATING MAY 30, 1989 AS LAW  
ENFORCEMENT TORCH RUN FOR SPECIAL OLYMPICS DAY

WHEREAS, the Special Olympics is an international organization for athletic events founded in 1968 by Eunice Kennedy Shriver and the Joseph P. Kennedy, Jr. Foundation; and

WHEREAS, the Special Olympics offers training and competition opportunities in 22 sports to one million special athletes in the United States and more than 70 countries throughout the world; and

WHEREAS, the Law Enforcement Torch Run for Special Olympics is an intra-state relay that will culminate at the University of South Florida on June 2, 1989 for the Opening Ceremonies for the Florida Special Olympics State Games; and

WHEREAS, law enforcement officers run intrastate relays carrying the lighted Special Olympics Torch, with local residents and businesses pledging contributions per runner to benefit Special Olympics;



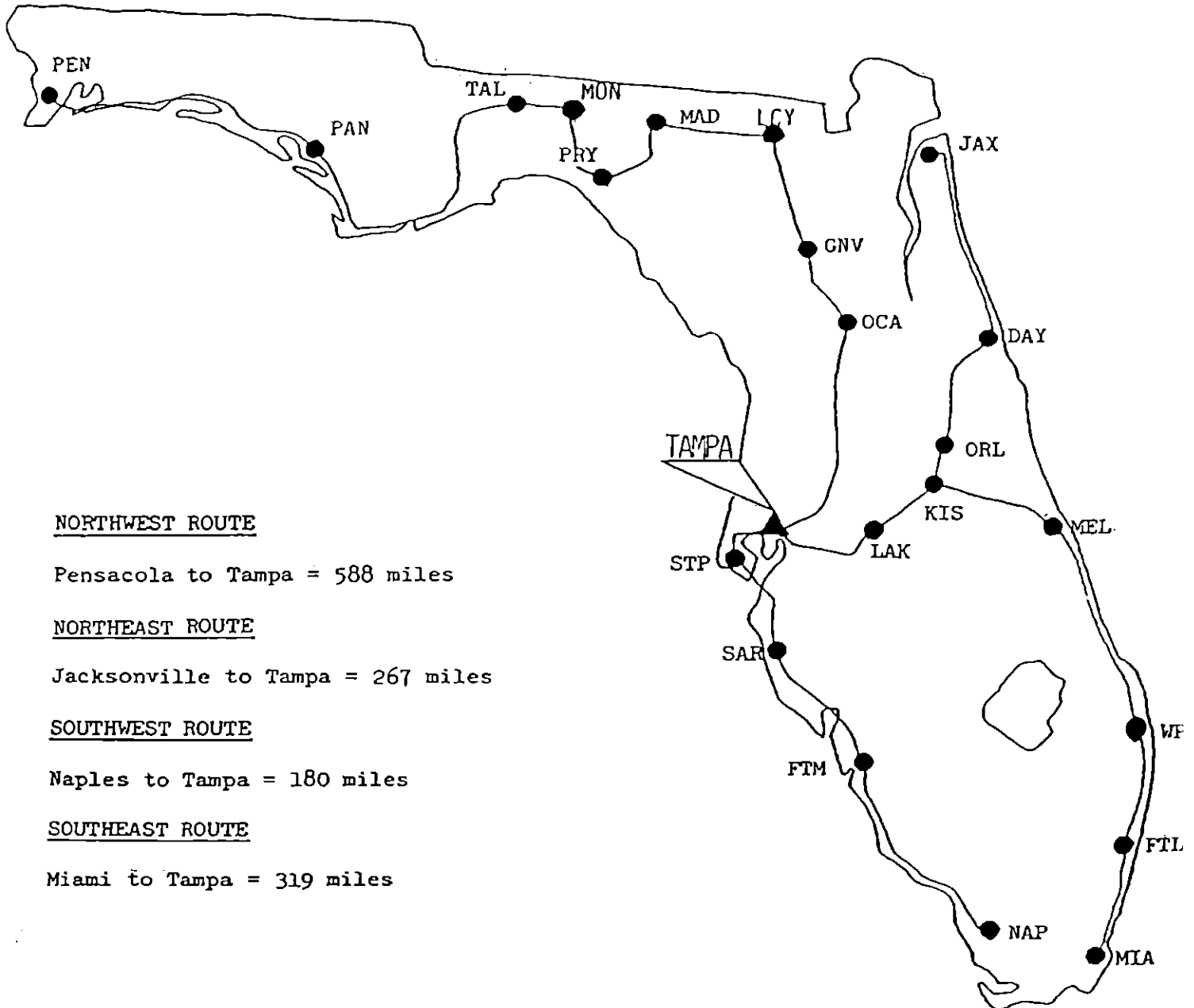
