RESOLUTION NO. 89- 203

Whereas, September 16, 1989 has been established by Congress and Proclaimed by the President of the United States as National POW-MIA Recognition Day; and

Whereas, this special day honors all Americans who were held as prisoners of war and all Americans who are still missing in action; and

Whereas, unified public awareness is of the greatest impact on the Vietnamese Government; and

Whereas, flying a POW-MIA flag from public buildings across the Nation is a meaningful and strong statement of support for this issue.

Now, Therefore, Be It Resolved By the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida that September 16 is designated as POW-MIA RECOGNITION DAY in St. Johns County and the Board of County Commissioners authorizes that the POW-MIA flag be flown over the St. Johns County Administration Building as a reminder to our citizens and visitors that 2,343 men and women are still missing in action in Southeast Asia.
