RESOLUTION NO. 90-198

WHEREAS, Farm-City Week is an annual national event to promote the understanding and cooperation between urban and rural residents; and,

WHEREAS, "Farm-City Week highlights the interdependence of the cities and the countryside"; and,

WHEREAS, "Rural residents look to the cities for services, jobs and a marketing outlet for their agricultural products, while urban dwellers rely on farming communities for food, portions of their clothing and shelter supplies"; and,

WHEREAS, "Quite simply we need each other"; and,

WHEREAS, with Florida's unprecedented growth, "especially its urban areas", "comes an influx of issues, such as growth management and environmental impact. To solve these problems, which affect both farmers and urban residents, we must understand each other's life-styles, communicate effectively and work together."

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners that November 16 - 22, 1990, be proclaimed
