

RESOLUTION 91-203

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA AMENDING RESOLUTION NO. 91-181, WHICH FIXED THE BOUNDARIES OF THE FIVE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' DISTRICTS IN ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, BY CHANGING THE BOUNDARIES OF DISTRICT 1 AND DISTRICT 4.

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida has determined that the district boundaries established and fixed in resolution 91-181, passed and adopted on November 12, 1991, do not align with the district boundaries recently adopted by the St. Johns County School Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida has reconsidered the boundaries of District 1 and District 4 as adopted in resolution no. 91-181, and acknowledge that the boundaries allow a greater deviation in population than the boundaries established by the St. Johns County School Board; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida desires to align its districts with those approved by the school board and to reduce the deviation created by the boundaries of District 1 and District 4 as adopted in Resolution no. 91-181.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to Chapter 124, Fla. Stat., section 1 of resolution no. 91-181 is hereby amended by deleting the legal descriptions of District 1 and District 4 therein and substituting instead the following legal descriptions for District 1 and District 4 of the County Commissioners' districts in St. Johns County, Florida:

## District 1

Beginning at the intersection of the northern boundary of St. Johns County and the Intracoastal Waterway; thence westerly along the northern boundary of St. Johns County to where said northerly boundary intersects the range line between Ranges 28 and 29 East; thence south along said range line to where said range line intersects the township line between Townships 4 and 5 South; thence west along said township line to a point where said township line intersects the range line between Ranges 27 and 28 East; thence north along said range line to where the same line intersects Durbin Creek; thence west along the south bank of Durbin Creek to Julington Creek; thence continuing west along the thread of Julington Creek to the mouth thereof; thence due west to the west margin of the main channel of the St. Johns River and the boundary line of Clay County; thence southerly along the main channel of the St. Johns river to a point due west of Toco Creek; thence east to the mouth of Toco Creek; thence easterly and northeasterly along the center of said creek to the point where it intersects the centerline of the powerlines which run north south and is 8000 feet west of County Highway 13A; thence north along the centerline of the powerlines to a point where they intersect Steven Colee Rd.; thence east and north along the centerline of Steven Colee Rd. to the point where it intersects Picolata Rd., or County Highway 208; thence easterly along Picolata Rd. to where it becomes State Highway 16 or the Charles Usinas Memorial Highway, continuing easterly to where State Highway 16 becomes Park Avenue; thence easterly along the centerline of Park Avenue to where it meets Atlantic Causeway; thence northeasterly along the centerline of Atlantic Causeway, also known as Atlantic Blvd. to the eastern boundary of the City Limits of St. Augustine; thence northerly along the City Limits of St. Augustine to the intersection with the center of Robinson Creek; thence northerly and easterly along Robinson Creek to the mouth of said creek; thence due east to the center of the Tolomato River; thence north along the center of the Tolomato River, also known as the Intracoastal Waterway to the point of beginning.

## District 4

Beginning at the intersection of the shores of the Atlantic Ocean with the north line of Section 15, Township 3 South, Range 29 East; said north line of Section 15 being also the northerly boundary of St. Johns County; thence westerly along the northerly boundary of St. Johns County to where said northerly boundary intersects the Intracoastal Waterway; thence south along the eastern shore of the Intracoastal Waterway to where said waterway is intersected by the easterly extension of the centerline of Robinson Creek; thence southwesterly along the centerline of Robinson Creek to the point where Robinson Creek intersects the most eastern City Limits of the City of St. Augustine; thence southerly along the eastern City limits of St. Augustine to the intersection of the City limits and the centerline of Vilano Rd., which is also known as A-1-A; thence easterly along the centerline of A-1-A to the intersection of the centerline of the Tolomato River; thence southerly along the centerline of the Tolomato River to the point where the centerline of the Tolomato River intersects the centerline of the St. Augustine Inlet; thence easterly along the centerline of the St. Augustine Inlet to the point where it meets the shores of the Atlantic Ocean; thence northerly along the shores of the Atlantic Ocean to the point of beginning.

Section 2. In addition, section 1 of resolution no. 91-181 is amended by deleting exhibit A attached thereto and substituting in its stead the chart known as St. Johns County 1991 County Commission and School Board Reapportionment Plan prepared by ATS Research of Jacksonville, Florida, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

Section 3. Section 2 of resolution no. 91-181 is amended to require the Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners to cause an accurate description of the five district boundaries, as amended, to be entered upon the minutes of the Board and a certified copy thereof to be published once each week for two consecutive weeks in a newspaper published in St. Johns County. The Clerk shall enter proof of such publication in the minutes of the Board.

Section 4. All other provisions of resolution no. 91-181 shall continue in full force and effect.

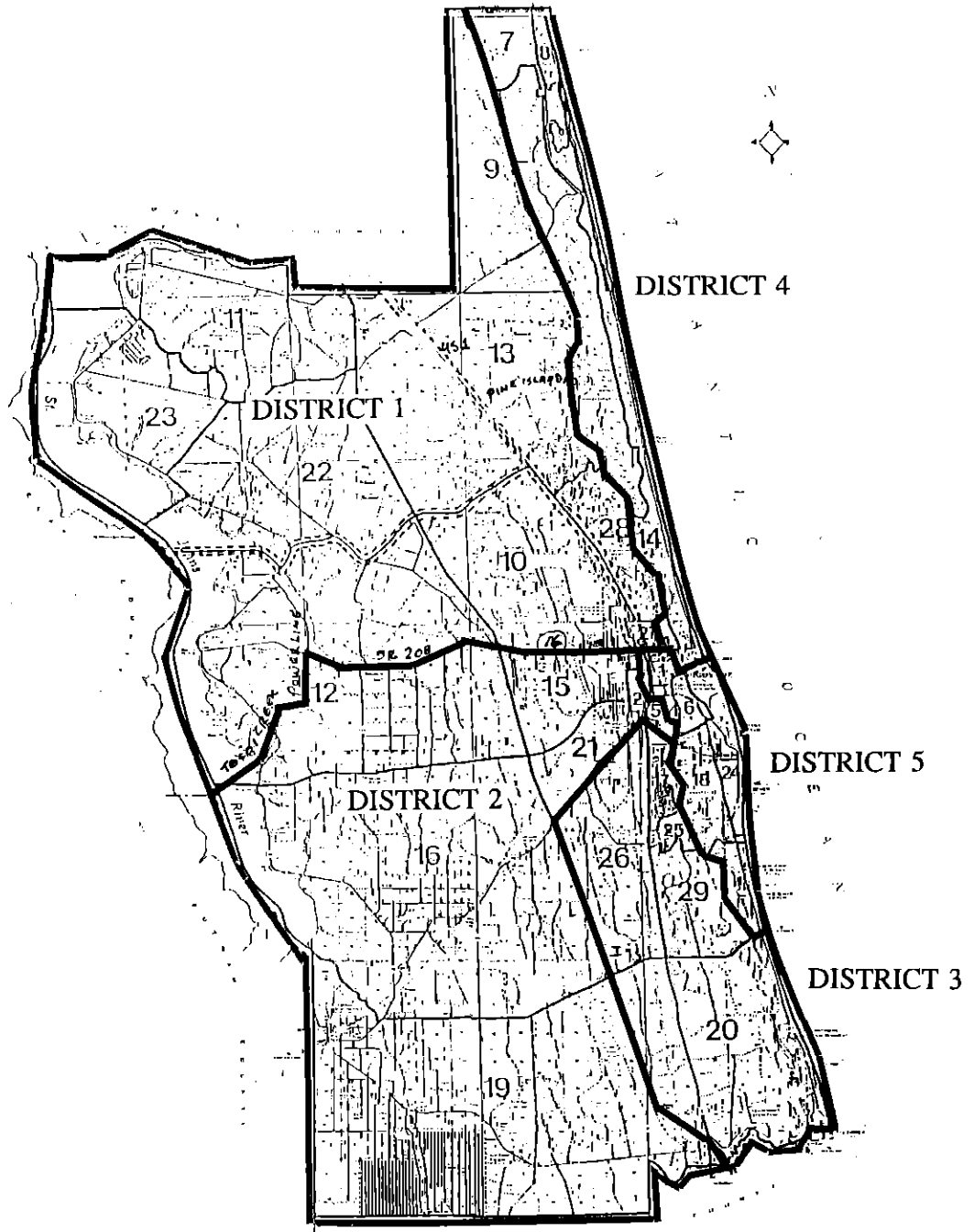
