

RESOLUTION NO. 92- 59

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA PROCLAIMING THE WEEK OF APRIL 5-11, 1992 TO BE NATIONAL LIBRARY WEEK IN ST. JOHNS COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the Right to Know is defined as the right to free and equal access to information, as guaranteed by America's libraries, without regard to age, sex, status or race;

WHEREAS, the Right to Know is one of our fundamental rights as U.S. citizens;

WHEREAS, the Right to Know is basic to informed citizenship, personal success and enjoyment;

WHEREAS, libraries serve as the primary guardians of the public's right to know by providing high quality library services and information to all Americans;

WHEREAS, libraries are leaders in challenging censorship and other threats to the public's right to know;

WHEREAS, the American Library Association has proclaimed April 5-11, 1992, National Library Week, with the theme "Your Right to Know: Librarians Make it Happen;"

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, this 24th day of March, 1992, that the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County Florida proclaim April 5-11, 1992, to be National Library Week in St. Johns County, Florida and encourage all residents to visit their libraries and to join in expressing great appreciation to librarians for protecting our Right to Know.
