

RESOLUTION NO. 92-90

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA REQUESTING THE CONTINUATION OF FUNDING FOR THE RECYCLING PROGRAM DURING THE FLORIDA STATE SPECIAL LEGISLATIVE SESSION CONCERNING THE ADOPTION OF THE STATE BUDGET.

WHEREAS, It has recently come to our attention that the Recycling and Education Grant monies which have been available to the Florida's 67 counties is possibly to be discontinued, and

WHEREAS, these monies have been derived from the State Sales Tax and possibly reallocated to support community colleges, and

WHEREAS, this would have a devastating effect on all 67 counties trying to meet the Florida State 1988 Solid Waste Management Act, requiring local governments to reduce their Solid Waste Stream by 30% by 1994, mainly through recycling, and

WHEREAS, the discontinuation of allocations to the Recycling and Education Grant monies would be a break in the State's commitment to the counties trying to achieve these very important recycling goals,

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida as follows:

St. Johns County opposes any attempts to seize or divert the current State funding of local recycling programs.
