RESOLUTION NO. 95-192

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY ESTABLISHING FEES TO BE CHARGED AT COMMERCIAL RECYCLING DROP OFF CENTERS AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, it is in the best interest of the citizens of St. Johns County to encourage commercial recycling; and

WHEREAS, there exists within the unincorporated areas of the County, centers that will accept and encourage commercial recycling for small businesses; and

WHEREAS, these commercial recycling centers should be self sufficient;

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, By the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida that the following fees and charges are established:

FEE TABLE

Cardboard, paper (mixed and office), newsprint, brown bags, magazines, catalogues, junk mail, computer and ledger paper

\$.40 per cubic foot to a maximum of \$10.00 per trip.

All other recyclables: aluminum cans, bi-metal cans, #1 and #2 plastic containers, and all colors of glass containers.

\$.40 per cubic foot, with no maximum charge.

No Charge for Household Hazardous Waste.

The County Administrator is authorized to modify or amend these fees and charges on an annual basis or as needed to insure that the commercial recycling centers are self supported.
