

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY TO TEMPORARILY SUSPEND RECYCLING AND REPORTING REQUIREMENTS, AND PENALTIES AND ENFORCEMENT PROVISIONS PERTAINING TO SECTION 8 (REGULATIONS FOR COMMERCIAL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT AND RECYCLING) OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY ORDINANCE 94-07

WHEREAS, St. Johns County has in effect Ordinance 94-07 to provide for a County recycling program; and

WHEREAS, Section 8 of said Ordinance pertains to regulations for commercial solid waste management and recycling; and

WHEREAS, said Section 8, in paragraph 8.C. requires Commercial Properties, as defined by said Ordinance, are as of March 10, 1997 required to recycle 100%, or the greatest percentage thereof which may be attained by using the most appropriate means and methods available at the time, of at least three (3) types of delineated materials; and

WHEREAS, said Section 8, in paragraph 8.D. requires Commercial Properties, as defined by said Ordinance; to provide certain reports to the County regarding recycling; and

WHEREAS, said Section 8, in paragraph 8.E provides for penalties and enforcement pertaining to Section 8 recycling and reporting requirements; and

WHEREAS, the County is not presently prepared to enforce the subject recycling requirements, wishes to avoid any appearance of selective enforcement and is actively considering amending Ordinance 94-07 due to the apparent non-feasibility of said sections; and

WHEREAS, there is no underlying common law, state statute, or other requirement that the County implement or enforce said recycling provisions:

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County that:


1. Sections 8.C, 8.D, and 8.E of Ordinance 94-07 shall not be enforced until the Board of County Commissioners has fully considered whether said sections remain in the public good.
2. Said temporary non-enforcement shall remain in effect until Ordinance 94-07 is revised, or a Resolution subsequent to this present Resolution cancels the temporary non-enforcement.
