

RESOLUTION NO. 2000- 110

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE SOLID WASTE DEPARTMENT OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY TO SUPPORT AND EXPAND ITS RECYCLED PAINT PROGRAM BY MAKING RECYCLED PAINT AVAILABLE FOR BID TO RESIDENTS OR COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes Section 403.706 requires Florida counties to initiate recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, innovative recycling programs targeting chemicals are encouraged by the State; and

WHEREAS, the removal of chemicals such as paint from the solid waste stream prevents contamination of land and water resources; and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County has engaged in a recycled paint program for two years; and

WHEREAS, the recycling of old paint into recycled paint is currently paid for by grant funds administered by the Solid Waste Department; and

WHEREAS, selling the recycled paint would allow the Solid Waste Department to expand the recycled paint program and allow for a larger quantity of paint to be recycled and distributed; and

WHEREAS, providing low cost paint to citizens is an economic benefit to the community, prevents possible contamination of resources, and complies with Florida law; and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County is authorized by law to sell personal property pursuant to Chapter 125, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that it is in the best interest of St. Johns County to sell recycled paint produced from its recycled paint program; and

WHEREAS, the highest and best use for this recycled paint is a non-commercial use, including household residential and community organization use; and

WHEREAS, an on-going bidding process would encourage participation in the recycled paint program by residents and community organizations of St. Johns County;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida:

Section 1. Recitals The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference as findings of fact and conclusions of law.

Section 2. Authority The Solid Waste Department of St. Johns County is authorized to make available recycled paint from its program to residents and community organizations of St. Johns County, under the following conditions:

- a) The Solid Waste Department shall post a sign in its facility which shall state substantially the following:

“Recycled paint available for bids during regular office hours.  
No bid less than \$3.00 per gallon shall be accepted.  
Maximum of 10 gallons per household or community organization.  
Not for resale or commercial painting services.”
- b) Bids will be reviewed and accepted on an on-going basis during regular office hours.
- c) Full payment is due at the time of sale.
- d) Every successful bidder shall read and sign the Application Form provided at the time of sale, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution as Attachment “A”.
- e) Every successful bidder shall read and comply with the information supplied on the label affixed to each gallon of paint. This label shall not be removed, defaced, or otherwise covered. A copy of the label is attached to this Resolution as Attachment “B”.

Section 3. Not for profit and government waiver Pursuant to Section 125.38, Florida Statutes, not for profit entities or government agencies may apply to the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners for a waiver of the minimum bid requirement set forth under Section 2. The fact of such application being made, the purpose for which such property is to be used, and the price therefor shall be set out in a resolution duly adopted by the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners.

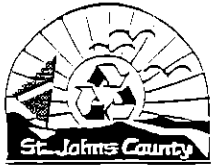

Please read Guidelines. Your signature below indicates that you have read the Guidelines and understand that the recycled paint is for residential and community organization use only.

**Guidelines for the Sale of Recycled Paint**

- (1) The quantity of paint allowed per household or community organization is ten (10) gallons. Paint is not for resale or commercial painting services.
- (2) Buyers must present current identification bearing a physical St. Johns County address. No post office boxes will be allowed.
- (3) No bid less than \$3.00 per gallon of paint will be accepted.
- (4) St. Johns County residents and community organizations may pay with cash, money orders, or checks.
- (5) Paint will be available for bids at the St. Johns County Solid Waste Department (Tillman Ridge), 3005 Allen Nease Road, during regular office hours, currently 8AM to 4PM, Monday through Friday. No paint will be sold on Saturday.
- (6) Community organizations may obtain up to ten gallons of paint by bid of no less than \$3.00 per gallon. Whoever represents the organization in the transaction must present verifiable evidence that the organization has its headquarters in St. Johns County, or that it has a verifiable office or project within St. Johns County.

**POST CONSUMER  
RECYCLED CONTENT:**

This recycled product contains a minimum of 75 percent post-consumer water based paint.

**DRY TIME:**

Tackfree-1 hour. Recoat-4 hours or less.

**COVERAGE:**

Two coat coverage over the darkest colors.

**SURFACE  
PREPARATION:**

Surfaces to be painted should be free of all contaminants including dirt, grease, rust, loose paint and mildew. Old glossy paint should be dulled by using a fine grade sandpaper. All cracks and holes should be filled in with an appropriate patching material. Make sure surfaces are completely dry prior to painting.

**APPLICATION:**

Stir paint thoroughly before using. If paint needs to be thinned add only a small amount of clean water. Do not mix paint with oil based paints or solvents. Paint only at temperatures above 50° F (10°C).

**CLEAN UP:**

Clean brushes and rollers using soap and water directly after painting. Do not discard clean-up water to the ground. Spills should be cleaned up immediately using an absorbent material. Once the absorbent material has completely, dispose of in the trash.

**DISPOSAL:**

Used paint should be disposed of properly. Do not dump liquid paint on the ground or in the trash. For information on how to dispose of leftover paint, contact the St. Johns County Waste Recycling Program at: (904) 824-

**CAUTION:**

Do not take internally. Avoid contact with skin or from breathing of vapors or sprays. Always wear safety equipment when necessary. Close container when not in use. **KEEP OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN.**
