

RESOLUTION NO. 2001- 200

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, ESTABLISHING AND FIXING THE BOUNDARIES OF THE FIVE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS' DISTRICTS IN ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA. THIS RESOLUTION ALSO REPEALS RESOLUTION NO. 91-181.

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA as follows:

Section 1. Pursuant to and based upon Article VIII, Section 1(e) of the Constitution of the State of Florida, Chapter 124, Florida Statutes, and other applicable Federal and State law and the redistricting requirements thereof and the written and verbal presentations made at various public meetings pertaining to this 2001 redistricting, the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, hereby (i) determines and finds that the facts contained in the chart designated as the St. Johns County 2001 County Commission and School Board Reapportionment Plan, a copy of which is attached hereto as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference, which contains the population statistics on which the district boundaries set forth herein are based, and which was prepared by Mr. John Libby, d/b/a/ American Public Dialogue of Jacksonville, Florida, is complete and accurate, and the population in each district is as nearly equal as possible; and (ii) establishes and fixes the boundaries of the five County Commissioners' Districts in St. Johns County, Florida as follows:

District 1

Beginning at the intersection of the northern boundary of St. Johns County and the eastern shoreline of the Intracoastal Waterway, also known as the Tolomato River; thence westerly, southerly, and westerly along the St. Johns County line; thence northerly along the county line to the point where the same line intersects Durbin Creek; thence west along the south bank of Durbin Creek, which is also the county line to Julington Creek; thence westerly along Julington Creek to the mouth of said creek; thence due west to the west margin of the main channel of the St. Johns River and the boundary line with Clay County; thence southerly along the main channel of the St. Johns River to the point where it intersects the centerline of the Shands Bridge and State Road 16; thence easterly along the centerline of State Road 16 to the point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 13 North; thence easterly and southerly along the centerline of State Road 13 North to the point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 16; thence easterly and southerly along the centerline of State Road 16 to the point where it intersects the centerline of International Golf Pkwy.; thence easterly and northerly along the centerline of International Golf Pkwy. to the point where it intersects the centerline of U.S. Highway 1 North; thence southerly along the centerline of U.S. Highway 1 North to the point where it intersects the centerline of Ponce Island Dr.; thence easterly along the centerline of Ponce Island Dr. to the point where it

intersects Robinson Creek; thence easterly, northerly and easterly along the centerline of Robinson Creek to the point where an extension of the centerline of Robinson Creek intersects the centerline of the Intracoastal Waterway; thence northerly along the centerline of the Intracoastal Waterway to the point where it intersects the centerline of Palm Valley Road; thence easterly and northerly along the centerline of Palm Valley Road to the point where it intersects the centerline of Landrum Lane; thence westerly, southerly and westerly, along the centerline of Landrum Lane and its westerly extension to the point where it intersects the eastern shoreline of the Intracoastal Waterway; thence northerly, along the eastern shoreline of the Intracoastal Waterway to the point of beginning.

District 2

Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of U.S. Highway 1 North with the centerline of International Golf Pkwy; thence westerly and southerly along the centerline of International Golf Pkwy to the point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 16; thence northerly and westerly along the centerline of State Road 16 to the point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 13 North; thence northerly and westerly along the centerline of State road 13 North to the point where it meets the centerline of State Road 16; thence westerly along the centerline of State Road 16 and the Shands Bridge where it intersects the west margin of the main channel of the St. Johns River and the boundary line with Clay County; thence southerly along the main channel of the St. Johns River, also known as the county line between St. Johns County and Clay and Putnam Counties, to the point due west of the mouth of Deep Creek, thence due east to the mouth of Deep Creek; thence southeasterly along the center of Deep Creek to a point where it intersects the range line between Ranges 27 and 28 East also known as the St. Johns County Line shared with Putnam County; thence south along the county line shared with Putnam County and east along the county line shared with Flagler County to the point where said line intersects the centerline of Amos Ave.; thence northerly along the centerline of Amos Ave., to its intersection with the centerline of Ashley Street; thence continue in a northerly direction, along the range line between Ranges 28 and 29 East to its intersection with a north-south dirt logging road at County Road 13 South; thence continue northerly, along said north-south dirt logging road (which approximates the aforementioned range line) to its intersection with County Road 305 at State Road 206; thence northerly, along the centerline of County Road 305 to a point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 207; thence northeasterly along the centerline of State Road 207 to a point where it intersects the centerline of Interstate 95, thence northerly along the centerline of Interstate 95 to the point where it intersects the railroad tracks of the Florida East Coast Railway; thence northeasterly, along the railroad tracks, to the point where the railroad tracks intersect the centerline of South Holmes Blvd.; thence southerly along the centerline of South Holmes Blvd. to the point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 207; thence northeasterly along the centerline of State Road 207 to the point where it intersects the centerline of South Ponce de Leon Blvd.; thence

southerly along the centerline of South Ponce de Leon Blvd. to the point where it intersects the centerline of Iroquois Ave.; thence easterly along the centerline of Iroquois Ave. and its easterly extension to the point where it intersects the centerline of the San Sebastian River; thence northerly along the centerline of the San Sebastian River to the point where it intersects State Road 16; thence easterly along the centerline of State Road 16 to the point where it intersects the centerline of North Ponce de Leon Blvd.; thence northerly along the centerline of North Ponce de Leon Blvd., which becomes U.S. Highway 1; thence northerly along the centerline of U.S. Highway 1 to the point of beginning.

District 3

Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of the San Sebastian River with the eastern extension of the centerline Iroquois Ave.; thence westerly along the centerline of Iroquois Ave. to a point where it intersects the centerline of South Ponce de Leon Blvd.; thence northerly along the centerline of South Ponce de Leon Blvd. to the point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 207; thence southerly and westerly along the centerline of State Road 207 to a point where it intersects South Holmes Blvd.; thence northerly along the centerline of South Holmes Blvd. to the point where it intersects the railroad tracks of the Florida East Coast Railway; thence southwesterly along the railroad tracks to the point where they intersect the centerline of Interstate 95; thence southerly along the centerline of Interstate 95 to the point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 207; thence southerly and westerly along the centerline of State Road 207 to the point where it intersects the centerline of County Road 305; thence southerly along the centerline of County Road 305 to its intersection with a north-south dirt logging road at State Road 206; thence southerly, along said north-south dirt logging road (which approximates the range line between Ranges 28 and 29 East) to its intersection with said Range line at County Road 13 South; thence continue southerly, along said range line to its intersection with the centerline of Amos Avenue at Ashley Street; thence southerly, along the centerline of Amos Ave., to the point where it intersects the county line separating St. Johns and Flagler Counties; thence easterly and northerly along the county line to the point where it intersects the center of Pellicer Creek; thence easterly along Pellicer Creek to the township lines between Townships 9 and 10, which is also the county line between St. Johns and Flagler County; thence easterly along the county line to the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean; thence northerly along the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean to the point where it intersects the easterly extension of the northerly line of Treasure Beach Subdivision (said northerly line also being the northerly line of U.S. Census Blocks 2016, 2017, and 2998); thence westerly, along said northerly line of Treasure Beach Subdivision and its easterly and westerly extensions to its intersection with the centerline of the Matanzas River; thence northerly along the centerline of the Matanzas River to the point where it intersects the centerline of the San Sebastian River; thence northerly and westerly along the centerline of the San Sebastian River to the point of beginning.

District 4

Beginning at the intersection of the shores of the Atlantic Ocean with the north line of Section 15, Township 3 South, Range 29 East; said north line of Section 15 being also the northerly boundary of St. Johns County; thence westerly along the boundary between St. Johns and Duval Counties to the eastern shoreline of the Intracoastal Waterway, also known as the Tolomato River; thence southerly along the eastern shoreline of the Intracoastal Waterway to the point where it intersects a westerly extension of Landrum Lane; thence easterly, northerly, and easterly along the centerline of Landrum Lane to the point where it intersects Palm Valley Road; thence southerly along the centerline of Palm Valley Road to the point where it intersects the centerline of Mickler Road; thence northerly and easterly along the centerline of Mickler Road to the point where it intersects State Road A1A North; thence continue easterly along the centerline of Ponte Vedra Blvd to the point where an extension of the line meets the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean, thence northerly along the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean to the point of beginning.

District 5

Beginning at the intersection of the shores of the Atlantic Ocean with the eastern extension of Ponte Vedra Blvd.; thence westerly along the centerline of Ponte Vedra Blvd. to the point where it intersects State Road A1A North; thence westerly and southerly along the centerline of Mickler Road to the point where it intersects the centerline of Palm Valley Road; thence southerly and westerly along the centerline of Palm Valley Road to the point where it intersects the centerline of the Intracoastal Waterway; thence southerly along the centerline of the Intracoastal Waterway to the point where it meets an easterly extension of the centerline of Robinson Creek; thence westerly, southerly and westerly along the centerline of Robinson Creek to the point where the centerline is intersected by the centerline of Ponce Island Dr.; thence westerly along the centerline of Ponce Island Dr. to the point where it intersects U.S. Highway 1, also known as North Ponce de Leon Blvd; thence southerly along the centerline of North Ponce de Leon Blvd. to the point where it intersects State Road 16; thence westerly along the centerline of State Road 16 to the point where it intersects the centerline of the San Sebastian River; thence southerly, easterly, southerly and easterly along the centerline of the San Sebastian River to the point where it intersects the centerline of the Matanzas River; thence southerly along the centerline of the Matanzas River to the point where it intersects the westerly extension of the northerly line of Treasure Beach Subdivision (said northerly line also being the northerly line of U.S. Census Blocks 2016, 2017, and 2998); thence easterly, along the northerly line of said Treasure Beach Subdivision and its westerly and easterly extensions to the point where it intersects the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean; thence northerly along the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean to the point of beginning.

Section 2. The Clerk of the Board of County Commissioners shall cause an accurate description of the above district boundaries to be entered upon the minutes of the Board and a certified copy thereof to be published once each week for two (2) consecutive weeks in a newspaper published in St. Johns County. The Clerk shall enter proof of such publication in the minutes of the Board.

Section 3. The Clerk shall forthwith furnish the Department of State with a certified copy of the minutes of the Board reflecting the description of the boundaries of each district.

Section 4. St. Johns County Resolution No. 91-181 is repealed.

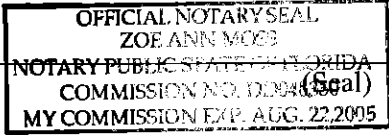

District 3
 Beginning at the intersection of the centerline of the San Sebastian River with the eastern extension of the centerline of Iroquois Ave.; thence westerly along the centerline of Iroquois Ave. to the point where it intersects the centerline of South Ponce de Leon Blvd.; thence northerly along the centerline of South Ponce de Leon Blvd. to the point where it intersects the centerline of State Road 207; thence southerly and westerly along the centerline of State Road 207 to a point where it intersects South Holmes Blvd.; thence northerly along the centerline of South Holmes Blvd. to the point where it intersects the railroad tracks of the Florida East Coast Railway; thence southwesterly along the railroad tracks to the point where they intersect the centerline of Interstate 95; thence southerly along the centerline of Interstate 95 to the point where it intersects the centerline of County Road 305; thence southerly along the centerline of County Road 305 to its intersection with a north-south dirt logging road of State Road 206; thence southerly, along said north-south dirt logging road (which approximates the range line between Ranges 28 and 29 East) to the intersection with said range line of County Road 13 South; thence continue southerly, along said range line to its intersection with the centerline of Amos Avenue at Ashley Street; thence southerly, along the centerline of Amos Ave., to the point where it intersects the county line separating St. Johns and Flagler Counties; thence easterly and northerly along the county line to the point where it intersects the center of Pellicer Creek; thence easterly along Pellicer Creek to the township line between Townships 7 and 10, which is also the county line between St. Johns and Flagler Counties; thence easterly along the county line to the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean; thence northerly along the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean to the point where it intersects the easterly extension of the northerly line of Treasure Beach Subdivision (said northerly line also being the northerly line of U.S. Census Blocks 204, 207, and 208); thence westerly, along said northerly line of Treasure Beach Subdivision and its easterly and westerly extension to its intersection with the center line of the Matanzas River; thence northerly along the centerline of the Matanzas River to the point where it intersects the centerline of the San Sebastian River; thence northerly and westerly along the centerline of the San Sebastian River to the point of beginning.

District 4
 Beginning at the intersection of the shores of the Atlantic Ocean with the north line of Section 15, Township 3 South, Range 29 East; said north line of Section 15 being the northerly boundary of the county; thence westerly along the boundary between St. Johns and Duval Counties to the eastern shoreline of the Intracoastal Waterway, also known as the Talamota River; thence southerly along the eastern shoreline of the Intracoastal Waterway to the point where it intersects a westerly extension of Landrum Lane; thence easterly, northerly, and easterly along the centerline of Landrum Lane to the point where it intersects Palm Valley Road; thence southerly along the centerline of Palm Valley Road to the point where it intersects the centerline of Mickler Road; thence easterly along the centerline of Mickler Road to the point where it intersects State Road 41A North; thence continue easterly along the centerline of Ponte Vedra Blvd to the point where an extension of the line meets the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean; thence northerly along the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean to the point of beginning.

District 5
 Beginning at the intersection of the shores of the Atlantic Ocean with eastern extension of Ponte Vedra Blvd.; thence westerly along the centerline of Ponte Vedra Blvd. to the point where it intersects State Road 41A North; thence westerly and southerly along the centerline of Mickler Road to the point where it intersects the centerline of Palm Valley Road; thence southerly and westerly along the centerline of Palm Valley Road to the point where it intersects the centerline of the Intracoastal Waterway; thence southerly along the centerline of the Intracoastal Waterway to the point where it meets an extension of the centerline of Robinson Creek; thence westerly and southerly along the centerline of Robinson Creek to the point where the centerline is intersected by the centerline of Ponce Island Dr.; thence westerly along the centerline of Ponce Island Dr. to the point where it intersects U.S. Highway 1, also known as North Ponce de Leon Blvd.; thence southerly along the centerline of North Ponce de Leon Blvd. to the point where it intersects State Road 16; thence westerly along the centerline of State Road 16 to the point where it intersects the centerline of the San Sebastian River; thence southerly, easterly, southerly and easterly along the centerline of the San Sebastian River to the point where it intersects the centerline of the Matanzas River; thence southerly along the centerline of the Matanzas River to the point where it intersects the westerly extension of the northerly line of Treasure Beach Subdivision (said northerly line also being the northerly line of U.S. Census Blocks 204, 207, and 208); thence easterly, along the northerly line of said Treasure Beach Subdivision and its westerly and easterly extensions to the point where it intersects the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean; thence northerly along the shoreline of the Atlantic Ocean to the point of beginning.
