

RESOLUTION 2007 - 72

A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, AMENDING THE FISCAL YEAR 2007 TRANSIT SYSTEM FUND BUDGET TO RECEIVE UNANTICIPATED REVENUE AND AUTHORIZE ITS EXPENDITURE BY ST. JOHNS COUNTY.

WHEREAS, the County operating budget is annually prepared prior to knowing the actual amount of grant funds which may be received by the Transit System Fund; and

WHEREAS, A Joint Participation Agreement, Contract # A0236, between the Florida Department of Transportation and St Johns County was executed in accordance with resolution 2005-157 which authorized the Chairman of the St Johns County Board of County Commissioner to sign the agreement and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County, Florida, when preparing the budget for Fiscal Year 2007, did not anticipate receiving grant funds from the Florida Department of Transportation above and beyond those projected; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation has made available Block Grant dollars in the amount of \$161,954 to provide financial assistance for public transportation projects; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Transportation has approved Block Grant funds for St. Johns County for Fiscal Year 2007 that exceeds budgeted grant amounts by \$161,954.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida, that:

1. The above recitals are incorporated by reference into the body of this resolution and such recitals are adopted as findings of fact.
2. The Transit System Fund revenue and expenditure budgets shall be adjusted to account for unanticipated funds from the Florida Department of Transportation Block Grant in the amount of \$161,954 for Fiscal Year 2007.
