RESOLUTION NO. 2010- 102

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE SOLID WASTE DIVISION OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY TO ALLOW PAYMENT FOR RECYCLED PAINT FOR THE ST. AUGUSTINE HUMANE SOCIETY AS PROVIDED FOR IN SECTION 2. OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY RESOLUTION NO.2000-110.

WHEREAS, St. Johns County passed Resolution 2000-110 on August 15, 2000 (a copy of which is attached hereto, and incorporated herein, as an Exhibit to this Resolution); and

WHEREAS, Resolution 2000-110 establishes a bid process for the distribution of paint recycled by the Solid Waste Division to residents and community organizations of St. Johns County; and

WHEREAS, Section 3 of Resolution 2000-110 provides that the Board of County Commissioners may, by resolution, may waive the maximum amount of recycled paint purchased per household or community organization, set forth under Section 2 (a), if such a waiver is applied for by not-for-profit entities or government agencies; and

WHEREAS, the St. Augustine Humane Society, a bona fide not for profit charitable organization operating out of St. Augustine, FL. registered with the State of Florida and the United States Internal Revenue Service has requested a waiver of the maximum amount of recycled paint purchased per household or community organization (a copy of said letter is attached hereto, and incorporated as an Exhibit to this Resolution); and

WHEREAS, the recycled paint obtained by the applicant would be used to paint the St. Augustine Humane Society;

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners authorizes a waiver of the above-referenced provisions of County Resolution 2000-110, so that the St. Augustine Humane Society may purchase up to 60 gallons of recycled County paint; and

WHEREAS, the granting of such a waiver is consistent with Section 125.38, Florida Statues, in that the County has determined that such a waiver serves a community or public interest.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, AS FOLLOWS:

- 1. The above recitals are incorporated by reference into the body of this Resolution, and such recitals are adopted as findings of fact.
- 2. That pursuant to Section 3 of County Resolution 2000-110, the Board of County Commissioners waives the maximum amount of recycled paint that might be purchased by a household or community organization, so that St. Augustine Humane Society may purchase up to 60 gallons of County recycled (off-white) paint, so that with joint participation by the Junior Service League of St. Augustine, they may paint the exterior of the St. Augustine Humane Society's buildings on May 15, 2010, which is designated as "Making a Difference" Day.
- 3. Consistent with County Resolution 2000-110, St. Johns County shall charge \$3.00 (three dollars), for each gallon of County recycled (off-white) paint.
- 4. To the extent that there are typographical and/or administrative errors or omissions that do not change the tone, tenor, or context of this Resolution, then this Resolution may be revised without subsequent approval of the Board of County Commissioners.

OF RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE SOLID WASTE DEPARTMENT OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY TO SUPPORT AND EXPAND ITS RECYCLED PROGRAM BY MAKING RECYCLED PAINT AVAILABLE FOR BID TO RESIDENTS OR COMMUNITY ORGANIZATIONS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, Florida Statutes Section 403.706 requires Florida counties to initiate recycling programs; and

WHEREAS, innovative recycling programs targeting chemicals are encouraged by the State; and

WHEREAS, the removal of chemicals such as paint from the solid waste stream prevents contamination of land and water resources; and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County has engaged in a recycled paint program for two years; and

WHEREAS, the recycling of old paint into recycled paint is currently paid for by grant funds administered by the Solid Waste Department; and

WHEREAS, selling the recycled paint would allow the Solid Waste Department to expand the recycled paint program and allow for a larger quantity of paint to be recycled and distributed; and

WHEREAS, providing low cost paint to citizens is an economic benefit to the community, prevents possible contamination of resources, and complies with Florida law; and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County is authorized by law to sell personal property pursuant to Chapter 125, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners finds that it is in the best interest of St. Johns County to sell recycled paint produced from its recycled paint program; and

WHEREAS, the highest and best use for this recycled paint is a non-commercial use, including household residential and community organization use; and

WHEREAS, an on-going bidding process would encourage participation in the recycled paint program by residents and community organizations of St. Johns County;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida:

Section 1. Recitals The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by reference as findings of fact and conclusions of law.

Section 2. Authority The Solid Waste Department of St. Johns County is authorized to make available recycled paint from its program to residents and community organizations of St. Johns County, under the following conditions:

a) The Solid Waste Department shall post a sign in its facility which shall state substantially the following:

"Recycled paint available for bids during regular office hours.

No bid less than \$3.00 per gallon shall be accepted.

Maximum of 10 gallons per household or community organization.

Not for resale or commercial painting services."

- b) Bids will be reviewed and accepted on an on-going basis during regular office hours.
- c) Full payment is due at the time of sale.
- d) Every successful bidder shall read and sign the Application Form provided at the time of sale, a copy of which is attached to this Resolution as Attachment "A".
- e) Every successful bidder shall read and comply with the information supplied on the label affixed to each gallon of paint. This label shall not be removed, defaced, or otherwise covered. A copy of the label is attached to this Resolution as Attachment "B".

Section 3. Not for profit and government waiver Pursuant to Section 125.38, Florida Statutes, not for profit entities or government agencies may apply to the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners for a waiver of the minimum bid requirement set forth under Section 2. The fact of such application being made, the purpose for which such property is to be used, and the price therefor shall be set out in a resolution duly adopted by the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners.
