JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR, OR DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE A MODIFICATION TO THE GRANT AGREEMENT ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA TO INCREASE THE FEDERAL SHARE BY \$5,297.00 AS UNANTICIPATED REVENUE FOR THE U.S. HIGHWAY 1 AND HEALTH PARK BOULEVARD SIGNAL REPLACEMENT PROJECT.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the State of Florida's Division of Emergency Management has informed St. Johns County that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has approved the obligation of Hazard Mitigation Grant Programs funds for the U.S. Highway 1 and Healthpark Boulevard intersection project; and

WHEREAS, the grant agreement was previously approved by Resolution 2012-284 and time extended by Resolution 2014-352 to retrofit the intersection of U.S. Highway 1 and Healthpark Boulevard by upgrading the existing strain pole intersection by replacing it with a mast arm traffic signal; and

WHEREAS, the project has been approved for \$395,297.00 total Federal share. This is an increase of \$5,297.00 of Unanticipated Revenue as set forth in the Federally Funded Subgrant Modification Agreement ("Agreement") attached hereto as Exhibit "A", incorporated by reference and made a part hereof; and

WHEREAS, the improvement to the intersection has been completed. This Resolution increases the Federal share amount due to change orders on said project.

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, as follows:

Section 1. The above Recitals are incorporated by reference into the body of this Resolution and such Recitals are adopted as finds of fact.

Section 2. The County Administrator, or designee, is hereby authorized to execute the Modification to Subgrant Agreement on behalf of the County for the purposes mentioned above.

MODIFICATION TO SUBGRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND ST. JOHNS COUNTY

This Modification Number Two is made and entered into by and between the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management ("the Division"), and St. Johns County ("the Recipient") to modify Contract Number 13HM-3E-04-65-01-286, dated October 23, 2012 ("the Agreement").

WHEREAS, the Division and the Recipient have entered into the Agreement, pursuant to which the Division has provided a subgrant to the Recipient under the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program of \$390,000.00, in Federal Funds; and

WHEREAS, the Division and the Recipient desire to modify the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement expired on September 30, 2015; and

WHEREAS, the Division and the Recipient desire to reinstate the Agreement, to extend the terms of the Agreement, and increase the Federal Funding by \$5,297.00 under the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows.

- 1. The Agreement is hereby reinstated and extended as though it had never expired.
- 2. Paragraph 3 of the Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

(3) PERIOD OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall begin October 23, 2012 and shall end April 29, 2016; unless terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (12) of this Agreement.

- 3. The Agreement is amended to increase the Federal Funding by \$5,297.00, for the maximum amount payable under the Agreement to \$395,297.00 (Three Hundred Ninety-Five Thousand, Two Hundred Ninety-Seven Dollars and No Cents).
- 4. The Budget and Scope of Work, Attachment A to the Agreement, are hereby modified as set forth in 2nd Revision Attachment A to this Modification, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- 5. All provisions of the Agreement being modified and any attachments in conflict with this Modification shall be and are hereby changed to conform with this Modification, effective on the date of execution of this Modification by both parties.

- 6. All provisions not in conflict with this Modification remain in full force and effect, and are to be performed at the level specified in the Agreement.
- 7. Quarterly Reports are due to the Division no later than 15 days after the end of each quarter of the program year and shall be sent each quarter until submission of the administrative close-out report. The ending dates for each quarter of the program year are March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31.

Attachment A (2nd Revision) Budget and Scope of Work

STATEMENT OF PURPOSE:

The purpose of this Scope of Work (SOW) is to provide protection to the intersection of U.S. Highway 1 and Health Park Boulevard, St. Augustine, St. Johns County, Florida; funded through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) **DR-1785-69-R**, as approved by the Florida Division of Emergency Management (Division) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The project is for hardening activities as a retrofit measure for the Recipient's buildings to reduce and/or mitigate the damage that might otherwise occur from severe weather or other hazards.

The Recipient, St. Johns County agrees to administer and complete the project per scope of work as submitted by the Recipient and subsequently approved by the Division and FEMA. The Recipient shall complete the work in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and Local Laws, Regulations, and Codes.

PROJECT OVERVIEW:

As a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) project, the Recipient, St. Johns County, shall upgrade the existing strain pole at the intersection of U.S. Highway 1 and Health Park Boulevard in St. Augustine, St. Johns County, Florida.

The HMGP project shall replace an existing strain pole signal with a mast arm traffic signal to withstand 130-mph wind gusts These improvements will prevent signal failure during major storm events.

The HMGP project installation will be in strict compliance with the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) specifications and any other applicable codes and local regulations. All materials shall be certified to meet wind and impact standards. The local municipality or county will inspect and certify installation according to the manufacture specifications.

TASKS & DELIVERABLES:

A. Tasks

1) The Recipient shall procure the services of a qualified and licensed Florida contractor and execute a contract with the selected bidder to complete the scope of work as approved by the Division and FEMA. The Recipient shall select the qualified, licensed Florida contractor in accordance with the Recipient's procurement policy as well as all Federal and State Laws and Regulations. All procurement activities shall contain sufficient source documentation and be in accordance with all applicable regulations.

The Recipient shall be responsible for furnishing or contracting all labor, materials, equipment, tools, transportation and supervision and for performing all work per sealed engineering designs and construction plans presented to the Division by the Recipient and subsequently approved by the Division and FEMA.

The Recipient and contractor shall be responsible for maintaining a safe and secure worksite for the duration of the work. The contractor shall maintain all work staging areas in a neat and presentable condition.

The Recipient shall ensure that no contractors or subcontractors are debarred or suspended from participating in federally funded projects.

The selected contractor shall have a current and valid occupational license/business tax receipt issued for the type of services being performed.

The Recipient shall provide documentation demonstrating the results of the procurement process. This shall include a rationale for the method of procurement and selection of contract type, contractor selection and/or rejection and bid tabulation and listing, and the basis of contract price.

The Recipient shall provide an executed "Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility, Voluntary Exclusion Form" for each contractor and/or subcontractor performing services under this agreement.

Executed contracts with contractors and/or subcontractors shall be provided to the Division by the Recipient.

The Recipient shall provide copies of professional licenses for contractors selected to perform services. The Recipient shall provide a copy of a current and valid occupational license or business tax receipt issued for the type of services to be performed by selected contractor.

2) The Recipient shall monitor and manage the procurement and installation of all opening protection products in accordance with the HMGP application and associated documentation as presented to the Division by the Recipient and subsequently approved by the Division and FEMA. The Recipient shall ensure that all applicable State, Local and Federal Laws and Regulations are followed and documented, as appropriate.

The project shall protect the building from windblown debris resulting from high wind storms which shall allow the function of the structures to continue following a severe wind event. The structure shall upgrade to meet Florida Building Code and/or Miami Dade Requirements, includes all exterior openings.

The Recipient shall fully perform the approved project, as described in the application, in accordance with the approved scope of work indicated herein, the estimate of costs indicated herein, the allocation of funds indicated herein, and all applicable terms and conditions. The Recipient shall not deviate from the approved project terms and conditions.

Upon completion of the work, the Recipient shall schedule and participate in a final inspection of the completed project by the local municipal or county building department (official), or other approving official, as applicable. The official shall inspect and certify that all installation was in accordance with the manufacturer's specifications. Any deficiencies found during this final inspection shall be corrected by the Recipient prior to Recipient's submittal of the final inspection request to the Division.

Upon completion of Task 2, the Recipient shall submit the following documents with sufficient supporting documentation, and provide a summary of all contract scope of work and scope of work changes, if any. Additional documentation shall include:

- a) Copy of permit(s), notice of commencement.
- b) Local Building Official Inspection Report and Final Approval.

- c) Signed and Sealed As-built project plans (drawings) by a Professional Engineer, as applicable, two hard copies and electronic version (via email or CD); and
- d) Letter of completion:
 - 1. Affirming that the project was completed in conformance with the approved project drawings, specifications, and scope; and
 - 2. Certifying Compliance with all applicable codes.
- e) All Product Specifications / Data Sheet(s) (technical standards) satisfying protection requirements on all products utilized.
- f) Proof of compliance with Project Requirements and Conditions contained herein.
- 3) During the course of this agreement the Recipient shall submit requests for reimbursement. Adequate and complete source documentation shall be submitted to support all costs (federal share and local share) related to the project. In some cases, all project activities may not be fully complete prior to requesting reimbursement of costs incurred in completion of this scope of work; however, a partial reimbursement may be requested.

The Recipient shall submit an Affidavit signed by the Recipient's project personnel with each reimbursement request, attesting to the completion of the work, disbursements or payments were made in accordance with all agreement and regulatory conditions, and that reimbursement is due and has not been previously requested.

The Recipient shall maintain accurate time records. The Recipient shall ensure invoices are accurate and any contracted services were rendered within the terms and timelines of this agreement. All supporting documentation shall agree with the requested billing period. All costs submitted for reimbursement shall contain adequate source documentation which may include but not be limited to: cancelled checks, bank statements, Electronic Funds Transfer, paid bills and invoices, payrolls, time and attendance records, contract and subcontract award documents.

Construction Expense: The Recipient shall pre-audit bills, invoices, and/or charges submitted by the contractors and subcontractors and pay the contractors and subcontractors for approved bills, invoices, and/or charges. Recipient shall ensure that all contractor/subcontractor bills, invoices, and/or charges are legitimate and clearly identify the activities being performed and associated costs.

Project Management Expenses: The recipient shall pre-audit source documentation such as payroll records, project time sheets, attendance logs, etc. Documentation shall be detailed information describing tasks performed, hours devoted to each task, and the hourly rate charged for each hour including enough information to calculate the hourly rates based on payroll records. Employee benefits shall be clearly shown.

The Division shall review all submitted requests for reimbursement for basic accuracy of information. Further, the Division shall ensure that no unauthorized work was completed prior to the approved project start date by verifying vendor and contractor invoices. The Division shall verify that reported costs were incurred in the performance of eligible work, that the approved work was completed, and that the mitigation measures are in compliance with the approved scope of work prior to processing any requests for reimbursement.

Review and approval of any third party in-kind services, if applicable, shall be conducted by the Division in coordination with the Recipient. Quarterly Reports shall be submitted by the Recipient and received by the Division at the times provided in this agreement prior to the processing of any reimbursement.

The Recipient shall submit to the Division requests for reimbursement of actual construction and managerial costs related to the project as identified in the project application, and plans. The requests for reimbursement shall include:

- a) Contractor, subcontractor, and/or vendor invoices which clearly display dates of services performed, description of services performed, location of services performed, cost of services performed, name of service provider and any other pertinent information;
- b) Proof of payment from the Recipient to the contractor, subcontractor, and/or vendor for invoiced services;
- c) Clear identification of amount of costs being requested for reimbursement as well as costs being applied against the local match amount;

The Recipient's final request for reimbursement shall include the final construction project cost. Supporting documentation shall show that all contractors and subcontractors have been paid.

B. **Deliverables**

Mitigation Activities consist of improving the intersection U.S. Highway 1 and Health Park Boulevard, St. Augustine, Florida, by replacing the existing strain pole signals with a mast arm traffic signals, preventing signal failure during major storm events.

Provided the Recipient performs in accordance with the Scope of Work outlined in this Agreement, the Division shall reimburse the Recipient based on the percentage of overall project completion.

PROJECT CONDITIONS AND REQUIREMENTS:

C. Engineering

- 1) The Recipient shall submit to the Division an official letter stating that the project is 100% complete and ready for the Division's Final Inspection of the project.
- 2) The Recipient shall provide a copy of the Notice of Commencement, and any local official Inspection Report and/or Final approval; as applicable.
- 3) The Recipient shall submit a final copy of the completed project's As-built drawings and all necessary supporting documentation, and provide a summary of all contract scope of work changes, if any.
- 4) The Recipient shall submit all Product Specifications / Data Sheet(s) (technical standards) satisfying protect requirements on all products utilized.
- 5) All installations shall be done in strict compliance with the Florida Building Code or Miami Dade Specifications. All materials shall be certified to exceed the wind and impact standards of the current local codes.
- 6) Product Specifications documentation satisfying protection requirements for all products utilized shall be provided to the Division for closeout.
- 7) The local municipal or county building department shall inspect the installation according to the manufacture's specification, and ensure that the above referenced standards have been met; documentation provided to the division for closeout.

D. Environmental:

- 1) The Recipient shall follow all applicable state, local and federal laws regulations and requirements, and obtain (before starting project work) and comply with all required permits and approvals. Failure to obtain all appropriate federal, state, and local environmental permits and clearances may jeopardize federal funding. If project is delayed for a year or more after the date of the categorical exclusion (CATEX), then coordination with and project review by regulatory agencies must be redone.
- 2) If any ground disturbance activities occur during construction, the Recipient shall monitor ground disturbance during construction, and if any potential archeological resources are discovered, shall immediately cease construction in that area and notify the Division and FEMA.
- 3) The building may be of local significance; the State Historical State Historic Preservation Officers (SHPO) has requested that the Recipient submit a completed Florida Master Site File Historic Structure Form and location map. Provide evidence of submittal at Project close-out.
- 4) Any change addition or supplement to the approved mitigation measure or scope of work that alters the project (including other work not funded by FEMA, but done substantially at the same time) shall require resubmission to the Division and FEMA for revaluation of compliance with the National Environmental Protection Act (NEPA) and Section 106 of the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) prior to initiation of any work. Non-compliance with these requirements may jeopardize FEMA's ability to fund this project. A change in the scope of work shall be approved by the Division and FEMA in advance regardless of the budget implications.
- 5) Construction vehicles and equipment used for this project shall be maintained in good working order to minimize pollutant emissions.

E. Programmatic:

- The Recipient must notify the Division as soon as significant developments becomes known, such as delays or adverse conditions that might raise costs or delay completion, or favorable conditions allowing lower costs or earlier completion.
- 2) The Recipient must "obtain prior written approval for any budget revision which would result in a need for additional funds" [44 CFR 13(c)], from the Division and FEMA.
- 3) Any extension of the Period of Performance shall be submitted to FEMA, 60 days prior to the expiration date. Therefore, any request for a Period of Performance Extension shall be in writing and submitted along with substantiation of new expiration date, and a new schedule of work, to the Division a minimum of seventy (70) days prior to the expiration date, for Division processing to FEMA.
- 4) The Recipient must avoid duplication of benefits between the HMGP and any other form of assistance, as required by Section 312 of the Stafford Act, and further clarification in 44 CFR 206.191.
- 5) The funding provided by the Division under this subgrant shall compensate for the materials labor and fees for the hardening activities as a retrofit measure for the Recipient's structure to reduce and/or mitigate the damage that might otherwise occur from severe weather or other hazards. The funding of this project by the Division does not confer or imply any warranty of use or suitability for the work performed pursuant to this agreement. The State of Florida disclaims all warranties with regard to this mitigation project, express or implied.

- including but not limited to, any implied warranties and/or conditions of satisfactory quality and fitness for a particular purpose, merchantability, or merchantable quality.
- 6) The materials and work funded pursuant to this Subgrant Agreement are intended to decrease the vulnerability of the site to losses and are specifically not intended to provide for the safety of inhabitants before, during or after a natural or manmade disaster.

This is FEMA project number **HMGP-1785-69-R**, funded under Tropical Storm Fay FEMA-1785-DR-FL.

The project was awarded by FEMA on January 11, 2012, the Recipient Agreement was executed on *October 23, 2012*, and the Period of Performance (POP) for this project shall end on *April 29, 2016*.

FINANCIAL CONSEQUENCES:

If the Recipient fails to comply with any term of the award, the Division shall take one or more of the following actions, as appropriate in the circumstances:

- 1) Temporarily withhold cash payments pending correction of the deficiency by the Recipient;
- 2) Disallow all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance;
- 3) Wholly or partly suspend or terminate the current award for the Recipient's program;
- 4) Withhold further awards for the program; or
- 5) Take other remedies that may be legally available.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the State of Florida's Division of Emergency Management has informed St. Johns County that the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) has approved the obligation of Hazard Mitigation Grant Programs funds for the U.S. 1 and Health Park Boulevard strain pole designed intersection project; and

WHEREAS, the scope of the project shall wind retrofit the intersection of U.S. 1 and Health Park Boulevard by upgrading the existing strain pole intersection by replacing it with a mast arm traffic signal; and

FEDERALLY-FUNDED SUBGRANT AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT is entered into by the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management, with headquarters in Taliahassee, Florida (hereinafter referred to as the "Division"), and St. Johns County, (hereinafter referred to as the "Recipient").

THIS AGREEMENT IS ENTERED INTO BASED ON THE FOLLOWING REPRESENTATIONS:

- A. The Recipient represents that it is fully qualified and eligible to receive these grant funds to provide the services identified herein; and
- B. The Division has received these grant funds from the State of Fiorida, and has the authority to subgrant these funds to the Recipient upon the terms and conditions below; and
 - C. The Division has statutory authority to disburse the funds under this Agreement. THEREFORE, the Division and the Recipient agree to the following:

(1) SCOPE OF WORK

The Recipient shall perform the work in accordance with the Budget and Scope of Work, Attachment A of this Agreement.

(2) INCORPORATION OF LAWS, RULES, REGULATIONS AND POLICIES

The Recipient and the Division shall be governed by applicable State and Federal laws, rules and regulations, including those identified in Attachment B.

(3) PERIOD OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall begin upon execution, and shall end January 31, 2014, unless terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions of Paragraph (12) of this Agreement.

(4) MODIFICATION OF CONTRACT

Either party may request modification of the provisions of this Agreement. Changes which are agreed upon shall be valid only when in writing, signed by each of the parties, and attached to the original of this Agreement.

(5) <u>RECORDKEEPING</u>

(a) As applicable, Recipient's performance under this Agreement shall be subject to the federal OMB Circular No. A-102, "Common Rule: Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments" (53 Federal Register 8034) or OMB Circular No. A-110, "Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Agreements with Institutions of Higher Education, Hospitals, and Other Nonprofit Organizations," and either OMB Circular No. A-87, "Cost Principles for State, Local and Indian Tribal Governments," OMB Circular No. A-21, "Cost Principles for Educational Institutions," or OMB Circular No. A-122, "Cost Principles for Non-profit Organizations".

- b) The Recipient shall retain sufficient records to show its compliance with the terms of the second state this Agreement, and the compliance of all subcontractors or consultants paid from funds under this Agreement, for a period of five years from the date the audit report is issued, and shall allow the Division or its designee, the State Chief Financial Officer or the State Auditor General access to the records upon request. The Recipient shall ensure that audit working papers are available to them upon request for a period of five years from the date the audit report is issued, unless extended in writing by the Division. The five year period may be extended for the following exceptions:
 - 1. If any litigation, claim or audit is started before the five year period expires, and extends beyond the five year period, the records shall be retained until all litigation, claims or audit findings involving the records have been resolved.
 - 2. Records for the disposition of non-expendable personal property valued at \$5,000 or more at the time it is acquired shall be retained for five years after final disposition.
 - 3. Records relating to real property acquired shall be retained for five years after the closing on the transfer of title.
- (c) The Recipient shall maintain all records for the Recipient and for all subcontractors or consultants to be paid from funds provided under this Agreement, including documentation of all program costs, in a form sufficient to determine compliance with the requirements and objectives of the Budget and Scope of Work Attachment A and all other applicable laws and regulations.
- (d) The Recipient, its employees or agents, including all subcontractors or consultants to be paid from funds provided under this Agreement, shall allow access to its records at reasonable times to the Division, its employees, and agents. "Reasonable" shall ordinarily mean during normal business hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., local time, on Monday through Friday. "Agents" shall include, but not be limited to, auditors retained by the Division.

(6) AUDIT REQUIREMENTS

- (a) The Recipient agrees to maintain financial procedures and support documents, in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles, to account for the receipt and expenditure of funds under this Agreement.
- (b) These records shall be available at reasonable times for inspection, review, or audit by state personnel and other personnel authorized by the Division. "Reasonable" shall ordinarily mean normal business hours of 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., local time, Monday through Friday.
- (c) The Recipient shall provide the Division with the records, reports or financial statements upon request for the purposes of auditing and monitoring the funds awarded under this Agreement.
- (d) If the Recipient is a State or local government or a non-profit organization as defined in OMB Circular A-133, as revised, and in the event that the Recipient expends \$500,000 or more in Federal awards in its fiscal year, the Recipient must have a single or program-specific audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of OMB Circular A-133, as revised. EXHIBIT 1 to this Agreement shows

the Federal resources awarded through the Division by this Agreement. In determining the Federal awards, including awards expended in its fiscal year, the Recipient shall consider all sources of Federal awards, including Federal resources received from the Division. The determination of amounts of Federal awards expended should be in accordance with the guidelines established by OMB Circular A-133, as revised. An audit of the Recipient conducted by the Auditor General in accordance with the provisions of OMB Circular A-133, as revised, will meet the requirements of this paragraph.

In connection with the audit requirements addressed in this Paragraph 6 (d) above, the Recipient shall fulfill the requirements for auditee responsibilities as provided in Subpart C of OMB Circular A-133, as revised.

If the Recipient expends less than \$500,000 in Federal awards in its fiscal year, an audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of OMB Circular A-133, as revised, is not required. In the event that the Recipient expends less than \$500,000 in Federal awards in its fiscal year and chooses to have an audit conducted in accordance with the provisions of OMB Circular A-133, as revised, the cost of the audit must be paid from non-Federal funds.

(e) Send copies of reporting packages for audits conducted in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, as revised, and required by subparagraph (d) above, when required by Section 320 (d), OMB Circular A-133, as revised, by or on behalf of the Recipient to:

(f) Pursuant to Section .320 (f), OMB Circular A-133, as revised, the Recipient shall send a copy of the reporting package described in Section .320 (c), OMB Circular A-133, as revised, and any management letter issued by the auditor, to the Division at the following address:

(g) By the date due, send any reports, management letter, or other information required to be submitted to the Division pursuant to this Agreement in accordance with OMB Circular A-133, Florida Statutes, and Chapters 10.550 (local governmental entities) or 10.650 (nonprofit and for-profit organizations), Rules of the Auditor General, as applicable.

- (h) Recipients should state the date that the reporting package was delivered to the reporting package was delivered to the reporting packages to the Division for audits done in accordance with OMB Circular A-133 or Chapters 10.550 (local governmental entities) or 10.650 (nonprofit and for-profit organizations), Rules of the Auditor General,
- (i) If the audit shows that all or any portion of the funds disbursed were not spent in accordance with the conditions of this Agreement, the Recipient shall be held liable for reimbursement to the Division of all funds not spent in accordance with these applicable regulations and Agreement provisions within thirty days after the Division has notified the Recipient of such non-compliance.
- (j) The Recipient shall have all audits completed by an independent certified public accountant (IPA), either a certified public accountant or a public accountant licensed under Chapter 473, Florida Statutes. The IPA shall state that the audit complied with the applicable provisions noted above. The audit must be received by the Division no later than nine months from the end of the Recipient's fiscal year.

(7) REPORTS

- (a) The Recipient shall provide the Division with quarterly reports and a close-out report. These reports shall include the current status and progress by the Recipient and all sub-recipients and subcontractors in completing the work described in the Scope of Work and the expenditure of funds under this Agreement, in addition to any other information requested by the Division.
- (b) Quarterly reports are due to the Division no later than 15 days after the end of each quarter of the program year and shall be sent each quarter until submission of the administrative close-out report. The ending dates for each quarter of the program year are March 31, June 30, September 30 and December 31.
- (c) The close-out report is due 60 days after termination of this Agreement or 60 days after completion of the activities contained in this Agreement, whichever first occurs.
- (d) If all required reports and copies are not sent to the Division or are not completed in a manner acceptable to the Division, the Division may withhold further payments until they are completed or may take other action as stated in Paragraph (11) REMEDIES "Acceptable to the Division" means that the work product was completed in accordance with the Budget and Scope of Work.
- (e) The Recipient shall provide additional program updates or information that may be required by the Division.
- (f) The Recipient shall provide additional reports and information identified in Attachment D.

(8) MONITORING

The Recipient shall monitor its performance under this Agreement, as well as that of its subcontractors and/or consultants who are paid from funds provided under this Agreement, to ensure that time schedules are being met, the Schedule of Deliverables and Scope of Work are being accomplished

done for each function or activity in Attachment A to this Agreement, and reported in the quarterly report.

In addition to reviews of audits conducted in accordance with paragraph (6) above, monitoring procedures may include, but not be limited to, on-site visits by Division staff, limited scope audits, and/or other procedures. The Recipient agrees to comply and cooperate with any monitoring procedures/ processes deemed appropriate by the Division. In the event that the Division determines that a limited scope audit of the Recipient is appropriate, the Recipient agrees to comply with any additional instructions provided by the Division to the Recipient regarding such audit. The Recipient further agrees to comply and cooperate with any inspections, reviews, investigations or audits deemed necessary by the Florida Chief Financial Officer or Auditor General. In addition, the Division will monitor the performance and financial management by the Recipient throughout the contract term to ensure timely completion of all tasks.

(9) LIABILITY

- (a) Unless Recipient is a State agency or subdivision, as defined in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes; the Recipient is solely responsible to parties it deals with in carrying out the terms of this Agreement, and shall hold the Division harmless against all claims of whatever nature by third parties arising from the work performance under this Agreement. For purposes of this Agreement, Recipient agrees that it is not an employee or agent of the Division, but is an independent contractor.
- (b) Any Recipient which is a state agency or subdivision, as defined in Section 768.28, Fiorida Statutes, agrees to be fully responsible for its negligent or tortious acts or omissions which result in claims or suits against the Division, and agrees to be liable for any damages proximately caused by the acts or omissions to the extent set forth in Section 768.28, Florida Statutes. Nothing herein is intended to serve as a waiver of sovereign immunity by any Recipient to which sovereign immunity applies. Nothing herein shall be construed as consent by a state agency or subdivision of the State of Florida to be sued by third parties in any matter arising out of any contract.

(10) DEFAULT

If any of the following events occur ("Events of Default"), all obligations on the part of the Division to make further payment of funds shall, if the Division elects, terminate and the Division has the option to exercise any of its remedies set forth in Paragraph (11). However, the Division may make payments or partial payments after any Events of Default without waiving the right to exercise such remedies, and without becoming liable to make any further payment:

(a) If any warranty or representation made by the Recipient in this Agreement or any previous agreement with the Division is or becomes false or misleading in any respect, or if the Recipient falls to keep or perform any of the obligations, terms or covenants in this Agreement or any previous agreement with the Division and has not cured them in timely fashion, or is unable or unwilling to meet its obligations under this Agreement;

- time during the term of this Agreement and the Recipient fails to cure this adverse change within thirty days from the date written notice is sent by the Division.
 - (c) If any reports required by this Agreement have not been submitted to the Division or have been submitted with incorrect, incomplete or insufficient information;
 - (d) If the Recipient has falled to perform and complete on time any of its obligations under this Agreement.

(11) <u>REMEDIES</u>

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If an Event of Default occurs, then the Division may, after thirty calendar days written notice to the Recipient and upon the Recipient's failure to cure within those thirty days, exercise any one or more of the following remedies, either concurrently or consecutively:

- (a) Terminate this Agreement, provided that the Recipient is given at least thirty days prior written notice of the termination. The notice shall be effective when placed in the United States, first class mail, postage prepaid, by registered or certified mail-return receipt requested, to the address in paragraph (13) herein;
- (b) Begin an appropriate legal or equitable action to enforce performance of this Agreement;
 - (c) Withhold or suspend payment of all or any part of a request for payment;
- (d) Require that the Recipient refund to the Division any monies used for ineligible purposes under the laws, rules and regulations governing the use of these funds.
 - (e) Exercise any corrective or remedial actions, to include but not be limited to:
 - 1. request additional information from the Recipient to determine the reasons for or the extent of non-compliance or lack of performance,
 - 2. issue a written warning to advise that more serious measures may be taken if the situation is not corrected,
 - 3. advise the Recipient to suspend, discontinue or refrain from incurring costs for any activities in question or
 - 4. require the Recipient to reimburse the Division for the amount of costs incurred for any items determined to be ineligible;
 - (f) Exercise any other rights or remedies which may be available under law.
- (g) Pursuing any of the above remedies will not stop the Division from pursuing any other remedies in this Agreement or provided at law or in equity. If the Division waives any right or remedy in this Agreement or fails to insist on strict performance by the Recipient, it will not affect, extend or waive any other right or remedy of the Division, or affect the later exercise of the same right or remedy by the Division for any other default by the Recipient.

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- (a) The Division may terminate this Agreement for cause after thirty days written notice. Cause can include misuse of funds, fraud, lack of compliance with applicable rules, laws and regulations, failure to perform on time, and refusal by the Recipient to permit public access to any document, paper, letter, or other material subject to disclosure under Chapter 119, Florida Statutes, as amended.
- (b) The Division may terminate this Agreement for convenience or when it determines, in its sole discretion that continuing the Agreement would not produce beneficial results in line with the further expenditure of funds, by providing the Recipient with thirty calendar days prior written notice.
- (c) The parties may agree to terminate this Agreement for their mutual convenience through a written amendment of this Agreement. The amendment will state the effective date of the termination and the procedures for proper closeout of the Agreement.
- (d) In the event that this Agreement is terminated, the Recipient will not incur new obligations for the terminated portion of the Agreement after the Recipient has received the notification of termination. The Recipient will cancel as many outstanding obligations as possible. Costs incurred after receipt of the termination notice will be disallowed. The Recipient shall not be relieved of liability to the Division because of any breach of Agreement by the Recipient. The Division may, to the extent authorized by law, withhold payments to the Recipient for the purpose of set-off until the exact amount of damages due the Division from the Recipient is determined.

(13) NOTICE AND CONTACT

(14) SUBCONTRACTS

If the Recipient subcontracts any of the work required under this Agreement, a copy of the unsigned subcontract must be forwarded to the Division for review and approval before it is executed by the Recipient. The Recipient agrees to include in the subcontract that (i) the subcontractor is bound by the terms of this Agreement, (ii) the subcontractor is bound by all applicable state and federal laws and regulations, and (iii) the subcontractor shall hold the Division and Recipient harmless against all claims of whatever nature arising out of the subcontractor's performance of work under this Agreement, to the extent allowed and required by law. The Recipient shall document in the quarterly report the subcontractor's progress in performing its work under this Agreement.

For each subcontract, the Recipient shall provide a written statement to the Division as to whether that subcontractor is a minority business enterprise, as defined in Section 288.703, <u>Florida Statutes</u>.

(15) TERMS AND CONDITIONS

This Agreement contains all the terms and conditions agreed upon by the parties.

(16) ATTACHMENTS

- (b) In the event of any inconsistencies or conflict between the language of this Agreement and the attachments, the language of the attachments shall control, but only to the extent of the conflict or inconsistency.

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- (a) This is a cost-reimbursement Agreement. The Recipient shall be reimbursed for costs incurred in the satisfactory performance of work hereunder in an amount not to exceed \$230.833.00, subject to the availability of funds.
- (b) Any advance payment under this Agreement is subject to Section 216.181(16), Florida Statutes, and is contingent upon the Recipient's acceptance of the rights of the Division under Paragraph (12)(b) of this Agreement. The amount which may be advanced may not exceed the expected cash needs of the Recipient within the first three (3) months of the contract term. For a federally funded contract, any advance payment is also subject to federal OMB Circulars A-87, A-110, A-122 and the Cash Management Improvement Act of 1990. All advances are required to be held in an interest-bearing account. If an advance payment is requested, the budget data on which the request is based and a justification statement shall be included in this Agreement as Attachment E. Attachment E will specify the amount of advance payment needed and provide an explanation of the necessity for and proposed use of these funds. No advance shall be accepted for processing if a reimbursement has been paid prior to the submittal of a request for advanced payment.
- (c) After the initial advance, if any, payment shall be made on a reimbursement basis as needed. The Recipient agrees to expend funds in accordance with the Budget and Scope of Work, Attachment A of this Agreement.
- (d) Invoices shall be submitted at least quarterly and shall include the supporting documentation for all costs of the project or services. Invoices shall be accompanied by a statement signed and dated by an authorized representative of the Recipient certifying that "all disbursements made in accordance with conditions of the Division agreement and payment is due and has not been previously requested for these amounts." The supporting documentation must comply with the documentation requirements of applicable OMB Circular Cost Principles. The final invoice shall be submitted within sixty (60) days after the expiration date of the agreement. An explanation of any circumstances prohibiting the submittal of quarterly invoices shall be submitted to the Division contract manager as part of the Recipient's quarterly reporting as referenced in Paragraph 7 of this Agreement.

If the necessary funds are not available to fund this Agreement as a result of action by the United States Congress, the federal Office of Management and Budgeting, the State Chief Financial Officer or under subparagraph (19)(h) of this Agreement, all obligations on the part of the Division to make any further payment of funds shall terminate, and the Recipient shall submit its closeout report within thirty days of receiving notice from the Division.

(18) REPAYMENTS

In accordance with Section 215.34(2), <u>Florida Statutes</u>, if a check or other draft is returned to the Division for collection, Recipient shall pay the Division a service fee of \$15.00 or 5% of the face amount of the returned check or draft, whichever is greater.

(19) MANDATED CONDITIONS

- (a) The validity of this Agreement is subject to the truth and accuracy of all the information, representations, and materials submitted or provided by the Recipient in this Agreement, in any later submission or response to a Division request, or in any submission or response to fulfill the requirements of this Agreement. All of said information, representations, and materials are incorporated by reference. The inaccuracy of the submissions or any material changes shall, at the option of the Division and with thirty days written notice to the Recipient, cause the termination of this Agreement and the release of the Division from all its obligations to the Recipient.
- (b) This Agreement shall be construed under the laws of the State of Florida, and venue for any actions arising out of this Agreement shall be in the Circuit Court of Leon County. If any provision of this Agreement is in conflict with any applicable statute or rule, or is unenforceable, then the provision shall be null and void to the extent of the conflict, and shall be severable, but shall not invalidate any other provision of this Agreement.
- (c) Any power of approval or disapproval granted to the Division under the terms of this Agreement shall survive the term of this Agreement.
- (d) This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts, any one of which may be taken as an original.
- (e) The Recipient agrees to comply with the Americans With Disabilities Act (Public Law 101-336, 42 U.S.C. Section 12101 et seq.), which prohibits discrimination by public and private entities on the basis of disability in employment, public accommodations, transportation, State and local government services, and telecommunications.
- (f) Those who have been placed on the <u>convicted</u> vendor list following a conviction for a public entity crime or on the <u>discriminatory</u> vendor list may not submit a bid on a contract to provide any goods or services to a public entity, may not submit a bid on a contract with a public entity for the construction or repair of a public building or public work, may not submit bids on leases of real property to a public entity, may not be awarded or perform work as a contractor, supplier, subcontractor, or consultant under a contract with a public entity, and may not transact business with any public entity in excess of \$25,000.00 for a period of 36 months from the date of being placed on the convicted vendor list or on the discriminatory vendor list.

- (g) Any Recipient which is not a local government or state agency, and which receives to receive the funds under this Agreement from the federal government, certifies, to the best of its knowledge and belief, that it and its principals:
 - 1. are not presently debarred, suspended, proposed for debarment, declared ineligible, or voluntarily excluded from covered transactions by a federal department or agency;
 - 2. have not, within a five-year period preceding this proposal been convicted of or had a civil judgment rendered against them for fraud or a criminal offense in connection with obtaining, attempting to obtain, or performing a public (federal, state or local) transaction or contract under public transaction; violation of federal or state antitrust statutes or commission of embezziement, theft, forgery, bribery, falsification or destruction of records, making false statements, or receiving stolen property;
 - 3. are not presently indicted or otherwise criminally or civilly charged by a governmental entity (federal, state or local) with commission of any offenses enumerated in paragraph 19(g)2. of this certification; and
 - 4. have not within a five-year period preceding this Agreement had one or more public transactions (federal, state or local) terminated for cause or default.

If the Recipient is unable to certify to any of the statements in this certification, then the Recipient shall attach an explanation to this Agreement.

In addition, the Recipient shall send to the Division (by email or by facsimile transmission) the completed "Certification Regarding Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility And Voluntary Exclusion" (Attachment H) for each intended subcontractor which Recipient plans to fund under this Agreement. The form must be received by the Division before the Recipient enters into a contract with any subcontractor.

- (h) The State of Fiorida's performance and obligation to pay under this Agreement is contingent upon an annual appropriation by the Legislature, and subject to any modification in accordance with Chapter 216, <u>Fiorida Statutes</u> or the Fiorida Constitution.
- (i) All bills for fees or other compensation for services or expenses shall be submitted in detail sufficient for a proper pre-audit and post-audit thereof.
- (j) Any bills for travel expenses shall be submitted in accordance with Section 112.061, Florida Statutes.
- (k) The Division reserves the right to unilaterally cancel this Agreement if the Recipient refuses to allow public access to all documents, papers, letters or other material subject to the provisions of Chapter 119, <u>Florida Statutes</u>, which the Recipient created or received under this Agreement.
- (i) If the Recipient is allowed to temporarily invest any advances of funds under this Agreement, any interest income shall either be returned to the Division or be applied against the Division's obligation to pay the contract amount.

- contractor who knowingly employs unauthorized alien workers, constituting a violation of the employment provisions contained in 8 U.S.C. Section 1324a(e) [Section 274A(e) of the Immigration and Nationality Act ("INA")]. The Division shall consider the employment by any contractor of unauthorized aliens a violation of Section 274A(e) of the INA. Such violation by the Recipient of the employment provisions contained in Section 274A(e) of the INA shall be grounds for unilateral cancellation of this Agreement by the Division.
 - (n) The Recipient is subject to Florida's Government in the Sunshine Law (Section 286.011, <u>Florida Statutes</u>) with respect to the meetings of the Recipient's governing board or the meetings of any subcommittee making recommendations to the governing board. All of these meetings shall be publicly noticed, open to the public, and the minutes of all the meetings shall be public records, available to the public in accordance with Chapter 119, <u>Florida Statutes</u>
 - (o) All unmanufactured and manufactured articles, materials and supplies which are acquired for public use under this Agreement must have been produced in the United States as required under 41 U.S.C. 10a, unless it would not be in the public interest or unreasonable in cost.

(20) LOBBYING PROHIBITION

- (a) No funds or other resources received from the Division under this Agreement may be used directly or indirectly to influence legislation or any other official action by the Florida Legislature or any state agency.
- (b) The Recipient certifies, by its signature to this Agreement, that to the best of his or her knowledge and belief:
 - 1. No Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid, by or on behalf of the Recipient, to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any Federal contract, the making of any Federal grant, the making of any Federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment or modification of any Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement.
 - 2. If any funds other than Federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with this Federal contract, grant, loan or cooperative agreement, the Recipient shall complete and submit Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure of Lobbying Activities."
 - 3. The Recipient shall require that this certification be included in the award documents for all sub-awards (including subcontracts, sub-grants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and that all sub-recipients shall certify and disclose.

This certification is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when this transaction was made or entered into. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by Section 1352, Title 31, U.S. Code. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

ANY AND ALL COPYRIGHTS ACCRUING UNDER OR IN CONNECTION WITH THE PERFORMANCE OF THIS AGREEMENT ARE HEREBY TRANSFERRED BY THE RECIPIENT TO THE STATE OF FLORIDA.

Scope of Work:

As a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program project, the Recipient, St. Johns County, proposes to improve the intersection of US 1 & Health Park Boulevard, St. Augustine, Florida 32806, by upgrading the existing strain pole designed intersection; by replacing it with a mast arm traffic signal to withstand 130 mph wind gusts. The signal shall be supported by galvanized mast arms, with the signal head rigidly attached to the mast arm. These improvements for the traffic signal will prevent possible delays caused by signal failure during major storm events.

Project Conditions:

- All Installations will be done in strict compliance with Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) specifications, which states that signalized intersections within ten (10) miles of the coastline need to be constructed as mast arms, and all materials to be certified to meet the wind and impact standards. The local municipal or county will inspect and certify installation according to the manufacture specification.
- 2. The Recipient must follow all applicable state, local and federal laws and regulations and requirements, and obtain (before starting project work) and comply with all required permits and approvals. If project work is delayed for a year or more after the date of the CATEX, then coordination with and project review by regulatory agencies must be redone.
- Any change, addition or supplement to the approved Scope of Work that alters the project (including other work not funded by FEMA, but done substantially at the same time) will require re-submission of the application to FEMA and NEPA re-evaluation before starting work.
- 4. The parties to this Agreement and the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) are generally governed by the following statutes and regulations:

In addition to the above statutes and regulations, the Recipient must comply with the following:

The Recipient shall fully perform the approved hazard mitigation project, as described in the Application and Attachment A (Budget and Scope of Work) attached to this Agreement, in accordance with the approved scope of work indicated therein, the estimate of costs indicated therein, the allocation of funds indicated therein, and the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Recipient shall not deviate from the approved project and the terms and conditions of this Agreement. The Recipient shall comply with any and all applicable codes and standards in performing work funded under this Agreement, and shall provide any appropriate maintenance and security for the project.

Any development permit issued by, or development activity undertaken by, the Recipient and any land use permitted by or engaged in by the Recipient, shall be consistent with the local comprehensive plan and land development regulations prepared and adopted pursuant to Chapter 163, Part II, Florida Statutes. Funds shall be expended for, and development activities and land uses authorized for, only those uses which are permitted under the comprehensive plan and land development regulations. The Recipient shall be responsible for ensuring that any development permit issued and any development activity or land use undertaken is, where applicable, also authorized by the Water Management District, the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, the Florida Department of Health, the Florida Game and Fish Commission, and any federal, state, or local environmental or land use permitting authority, where required. The Recipient agrees that any repair or construction shall be in accordance with applicable standards of safety, decency, and sanitation, and in conformity with applicable codes, specifications and standards.

The Recipient will provide and maintain competent and adequate engineering supervision at the construction site to ensure that the completed work conforms with the approved plans and specifications and will furnish progress reports and such other information to HMGP as may be required.

If the hazard mitigation project described in Attachment A includes an acquisition or relocation project, then the Recipient shall ensure that, as a condition of funding under this Agreement, the owner of the affected real property shall record in the public records of the county where it is located the following covenants and restrictions, which shall run with and apply to any property acquired, accepted, or from which a structure will be removed pursuant to the project:

(1) The property will be dedicated and maintained in perpetuity for a use that is compatible with open space, recreational, or wetlands management practices;

- (2) No new structure will be erected on property other than:
 - a public facility that is open on all sides and functionally related to a designated open space;

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- b. a restroom; or
- (3) A structure that the Director of the Federal Emergency Management Agency approves in writing before the commencement of the construction of the structure:
- (4) After the date of the acquisition or relocation no application for disaster assistance for any purpose will be made to any Federal entity and no disaster assistance will be provided for the property by any Federal source; and
- (5) If any of these covenants and restrictions is violated by the owner or by some third party with the knowledge of the owner, fee simple title to the Property described herein shall be conveyed to the Board of Trustees of the Internal Improvement Trust Fund of the State of Florida without further notice to the owner, its successors and assigns, and the owner, its successors and assigns shall forfeit all right, title and interest in and to the property.

HMGP Contract Manager will evaluate requests for cost overruns and submit to the Regional Director written determination of cost overrun eligibility. Cost overruns shall meet Federal regulations set forth in 44CFR 206.438(b).

The National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) stipulates that additions or amendments to a HMGP Recipient Scope of Work (SOW) shall be reviewed by all State and Federal agencies participating in the NEPA process.

As a reminder, the Recipient must obtain prior approval from the State, before implementing changes to the approved project Scope of Work (SOW). Per the Uniform Administrative Requirements for Grants and Cooperative Agreements to State and Local Governments:

No member, officer, or employee of the Recipient or its designees or agents, no member of the governing body of the locality in which the program is situated, and no other public official of the locality or localities who exercises any functions or responsibilities with respect to the program during his tenure or for one year after, shall have any interest, direct or indirect, in any contract or subcontract, or the proceeds, for work be performed in connection with the program assisted under this Agreement. The Recipient shall incorporate, in all contracts or subcontracts a provision prohibiting any interest pursuant to the purpose stated above;
- (d) All Recipient contracts for which the State Legislature is in any part a funding source, shall contain language to provide for termination with reasonable costs to be paid by the Recipient for eligible contract work completed prior to the date the notice of suspension of funding was received by the Recipient. Any cost incurred after a notice of suspension or termination is received by the Recipient may not be funded with funds provided under this Agreement unless previously approved in writing by the Division. - Provide supervision over contractors or employees employed by the Recipient to remove (5) asbestos and lead from demolished or otherwise applicable structures.
- (6) Leave the demolished site clean, level and free of debris.
- **(7)** Notify the Division promptly of any unusual existing condition which hampers the contractor's work.
- (8) Obtain all required permits.
- (9) Provide addresses and marked maps for each site where water wells and septic tanks are to be closed along with the number of wells and septic tanks located on each site. Provide documentation of closures.

- (10) Comply with mandatory standards and policies relating to energy efficiency which are contained in the State Energy Conservation Plan issued in compliance with the Energy Policy and Conservation Act (Public Law 94-163).
- (11) Comply with all applicable standards, orders, or requirements issued under Section 112 and 306 of the Clean Air Act (42 U.S.C. 1857 (h), Section 508 of the Clean Water Act (33 U.S. 1368), Executive Order 11738, and the U.S. Environmental Protection Agency regulations (40 CFR Part 15 and 61). This clause shall be added to any subcontracts.
- (12) Provide documentation of public notices for demolition activities.

MODIFICATION TO SUBGRANT AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE DIVISION OF EMERGENCY MANAGEMENT AND ST. JOHNS COUNTY

This Modification Number One is made and entered into by and between the State of Florida, Division of Emergency Management ("the Division"), and St. Johns County ("the Recipient") to modify Contract Number 12HM-3E-04-65-01-007, dated October 23, 2012 ("the Agreement").

WHEREAS, the Division and the Recipient have entered into the Agreement, pursuant to which the Division has provided a subgrant to the Recipient under the Hazard Mitigation Grants Program of \$230,833.00, in Federal Funds; and

WHEREAS, the Division and the Recipient desire to modify the Agreement; and

WHEREAS, the Agreement expired on January 31, 2014; and

WHEREAS, the Division and the Recipient desire to reinstate and extend the terms of the Agreement, and increase the Federal Funding under the Agreement.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the mutual promises of the parties contained herein, the parties agree as follows:

1. Paragraph 3 of the Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

(3) PERIOD OF AGREEMENT

This Agreement shall begin October 23, 2012, and shall end September 30, 2015; unless terminated earlier in accordance with the provisions of paragraph (12) of this

- 2. The Agreement is amended to increase the Federal Funding by \$159,167.00, for the maximum amount payable under this Agreement to \$390,000.00; (Three Hundred Ninety Thousand Dollars and No Cents).
- The Budget and Scope of Work, Attachment A to this Agreement, are hereby modified as set forth in 1st Revised Attachment A to this Modification, a copy of which is attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference.
- 4. Paragraph 11 of the Agreement is hereby amended to read as follows:

(11) REMEDIES

If an Event of Default occurs, then the Division shall, after thirty calendar days written notice to the Recipient and upon the Recipient's failure to cure within those thirty days, exercise any one or more of the following remedies, either concurrently or consecutively:

- (a) Terminate this Agreement, provided that the Recipient is given at least thirty days prior written notice of the termination. The notice shall be effective when placed in the United States, first class mail, postage prepaid, by registered or certified mail-return receipt requested, to the address in Paragraph (13) herein;
- (b) Begin an appropriate legal or equitable action to enforce performance of this Agreement;
- (c) Withhold or suspend payment of all or any part of a request for payment:
- (d) Require that the Recipient refund to the Division any monies used for ineligible purposes under the laws, rules and regulations governing the use of these funds;
- (e) Exercise any corrective or remedial actions, to include but not limited to:
 - 1) Request additional information from the Recipient to determine the reasons for or the extent of non-compliance or lack of performance,
 - 2) issue a written warning to advise that more serious measures may be taken if the situation is not corrected,
 - 3) Advise the Recipient to suspend, discontinue or refrain from incurring costs for any activities in question, or
 - 4) Require the Recipient to reimburse the Division for the amount of costs incurred for any items determined to be ineligible.
- (f) Exercise any other rights or remedies which may be available under law:
- (g) Pursuing any of the above remedies will not stop the Division from pursuing any other remedies in this Agreement or provided at law or in equity. If the Division waives any right or remedy in this Agreement or fails to insist on strict performance by the Recipient, it will not affect, extend or waive any other right or remedy of the Division, or affect the later exercise of the same right or remedy by the Division for any other default by the Recipient.
- 5. All provisions of the Agreement being modified and any attachments thereto in conflict with Modification shall be and are hereby changed to conform to this Modification, effective as of the date of the last execution of this Modification by both parties.
- 6. All provisions not in conflict with this Modification remain in full force and effect, and are to be performed at the level specified in the Agreement.
- 7. Quarterly Reports are due to the Division no later than 15 days after the end of each quarter of the program year and shall be sent each quarter until submission of the administrative closeout report. The ending dates of each quarter of the program year are March 31, June 30, September 30, and December 31.

Budget and Scope of Work

Statement of Purpose:

The purpose of this Scope of Work is to provide protection to the intersection of U.S. Highway 1 and Health Park Boulevard, St. Augustine, Florida; funded through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) DR-1785-69-R, as approved by the Florida Division of Emergency Management (Division) and the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA). The improvements will prevent signal failure during major storm events, which is a main access point for Flagler Hospital, and a County Hurricane Evacuation Route.

St. Johns County (Recipient) agrees to administer and complete the project per sealed engineering designs and construction plans as submitted by the Recipient and subsequently approved by the Division and FEMA. The Recipient will complete the work in accordance with all applicable Federal, State and Local Laws, Regulations, and Codes.

Project Overview:

As a Hazard Mitigation Grant Program project, the Recipient, St. Johns County, shall upgrade the existing strain pole at the intersection of U.S. Highway 1 and Health Park Boulevard, St Augustine, St. Johns County, Florida; (29.862400, -81.322359).

The proposed improvements will upgrade the current strain pole signal by replacing it with a mast arm design traffic Signal to withstand 130-mph wind gusts of more severe storms. The signal shall be supported by galvanized mast arms, with the signal head rigidly attached to the mast arm. Improvements for the traffic signal will prevent possible delays caused by signal failure during major storm events.

The signal pole shall be brought up to Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) current code, and all installations will be in strict compliance with FDOT specifications; which states that signalized intersections within ten (10) miles of the coastline need to be constructed as mast arms, and all materials to be certified to meet the wind and impact standards. The local municipality or county will inspect and certify installation according to the manufacture specifications.

Tasks & Deliverables:

A. Tasks

1) The Recipient shall procure the services of a qualified and licensed Florida contractor and execute a contract with the selected bidder to complete the scope of work as approved by the Division and FEMA. The Recipient shall select the qualified, licensed Florida contractor in accordance with the Recipient's procurement policy as well as all federal and state laws and regulations. All procurement activities will contain sufficient source documentation and be in accordance will all applicable regulations.

The Recipient shall be responsible for furnishing or contracting all labor, materials, equipment, tools, transportation and supervision and for performing all work per sealed engineering designs and construction plans presented to the Division by the Recipient and subsequently approved by the Division and FEMA.

The Recipient and contractor shall be responsible for maintaining a safe and secure worksite for the duration of the work. The contractor shall maintain all work staging areas in a neat and presentable condition.

The Recipient shall ensure that no contractors or subcontractors are debarred or suspended from participating in federally funded projects. The selected contractor shall have a current and valid occupational license/business tax receipt issued for the type of services being performed.

2) The Recipient shall monitor and manage the procurement and installation to upgrade the existing strain pole with a mast arm design traffic signal, at the intersection of U.S. Highway 1 and Health Park Boulevard, St Augustine, St. Johns County, Fiorida; in accordance with the HMGP application and associated documentation as presented to the Division by the Recipient and subsequently approved by the Division and FEMA. The Recipient shall ensure that applicable State, Local and Federal Laws and Regulations are followed and documented, as appropriate, and meet the Fiorida Building Code requirements.

The improvements will upgrade the current strain pole signal by replacing it with a mast arm design traffic Signal to withstand 130-mph wind gusts. The signal shall be supported by galvanized mast arms, with the signal head rigidly attached to the mast arm. The signal pole shall be brought up to Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) current code, and all installations will be in strict compliance with FDOT specifications; that signalized intersections within ten (10) miles of the coastline need to be constructed as mast arms, and all materials to be certified to meet the wind and impact standards.

The Recipient shall fully perform the approved project, as described in the application, in accordance with the approved scope of work indicated herein, the estimate of costs indicated herein, the allocation of funds indicated herein, and all applicable terms and conditions. The Recipient shall not deviate from the approved project terms and conditions.

Construction activities will be completed by a qualified and licensed Florida contractor. All construction activities will be monitored by a qualified engineer. The Recipient must complete the project in accordance will all required permits. All work will be completed in accordance with applicable codes and standards.

Upon completion of the work, the Recipient will schedule and participate in a final inspection of the completed project by the local building official or other approving official, if applicable. Any deficiencies found during this final inspection will be corrected by the Recipient prior to Recipient's submittal of the final inspection request to the Division.

3) During the course of this agreement the Recipient is required to submit requests for reimbursement. Adequate and complete source documentation is required to be submitted to support all costs (federal share and local share) related to the project. In some cases, all project activities may not be fully complete prior to requesting reimbursement of costs incurred in completion of this scope of work; however, a partial reimbursement may be requested.

The Recipient is required to submit an Affidavit signed by the Recipient's project personnel with each reimbursement request attesting to the completion of the work, disbursements or payments were made in accordance with all agreement and regulatory conditions, and that reimbursement is due and has not been previously requested.

The Recipient must maintain accurate time records. The Recipient must ensure invoices are accurate and any contracted services were rendered within the terms and timelines of this agreement. All supporting documentation must agree with the requested billing period. All costs submitted for reimbursement must contain adequate source documentation which may include but not be limited to: cancelled checks, bank statements, Electronic Funds Transfer, paid bills and invoices, payrolls, time and attendance records, contract and subcontract award documents.

Construction Expense: The Recipient will pre-audit bills, invoices, and/or charges submitted by the contractors and subcontractors and pay the contractors and subcontractors for approved bills, invoices, and/or charges. Recipient will ensure that all contractor/subcontractor bills, invoices, and/or charges are legitimate and clearly identify the activities being performed and associated costs.

The Division will review all submitted requests for reimbursement for basic accuracy of information. Further, the Division will ensure that no unauthorized work was completed prior to the approved project start date by verifying vendor and contractor invoices. The Division will verify that reported

costs were incurred in the performance of eligible work, that the approved work was completed, and that the mitigation measures are in compliance with the approved scope of work prior to processing any requests for reimbursement.

Review and approval of any third party in-kind services, if applicable, will be conducted by the Division in coordination with the Recipient. Quarterly reports must be submitted by the Recipient and received by the Division at the times provided in this agreement prior to the processing of any reimbursement.

B. **Deliverables**

1) The Recipient will provide documentation demonstrating the results of the procurement process. This will include a rationale for the method of procurement and selection of contract type, contractor selection and/or rejection and bid tabulation and listing, and the basis of contract price.

The Recipient will provide an executed "Debarment, Suspension, Ineligibility, Voluntary Exclusion Form" for each contractor and/or subcontractor performing services under this agreement.

Executed contracts with contractors and/or subcontractors will be provided to the Division by the Recipient.

The Recipient will provide copies of professional licenses for contractors selected to perform services. The Recipient shall provide a copy of a current and valid occupational license or business tax receipt issued for the type of services to be performed by selected contractor.

- 2) Upon completion of Task 2, the Recipient will submit a final copy of the project's as-built drawings and necessary supporting documentation, and will provide a summary of all contract scope of work changes, if any. Additional documentation will include:
 - a) Copy of permit(s), notice of commencement;
 - b) Local Building Official Inspection Report and Final Approval, if applicable:
 - c) Certified Letter of Completion from Engineer of Record: The Recipient's Engineer of Record shall
 provide a formal certificate or letter affirming that the project has been completed in conformance
 with the approved project drawings, specifications, and project Requirements and Conditions;
 - d) All Product Specifications / Data Sheet(s) (technical standards) satisfying protect requirements on all products utilized:
 - e) Letter that Project Conditions and Performance Requirements contained herein, were followed:
 - f) Photographs (color) of completed project sites.
- 3) The Recipient shall submit to the Division requests for reimbursement of actual construction and managerial costs related to the project as identified in the project application, sealed engineering designs, and construction plans. The requests for reimbursement will include:
 - a) Contractor, subcontractor, and/or vendor invoices which clearly display dates of services performed, description of services performed, location of services performed, cost of services performed, name of service provider and any other pertinent information;
 - b) Proof of payment from the Recipient to the contractor, subcontractor, and/or vendor for invoiced services;
 - Clear identification of amount of costs being requested for reimbursement as well as costs being applied against the local match amount;
 - d) The Recipient's final request for reimbursement should include the final construction project cost. Supporting documentation must show that all contractors and subcontractors have been paid.

Project Conditions and Performance Requirements

C. Environmental

- 1) The Recipient must follow all applicable State, Local and Federal laws, regulations and requirements, and obtain (before starting project work) and comply with all required permits and approvals. If project work is delayed for a year or more after the date of the CATEX, then coordination with and project review by regulatory agencies must be redone. Copies of permits/compliance shall be included with closeout documentation. Failure to obtain all appropriate federal, state, and local environmental permits and clearances may jeopardize federal funding.
- Any change, addition or supplement to the approved Scope of Work that alters the project (including other work not funded by FEMA, but done substantially at the same time) will require re-submission of the application to FEMA for the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) re-evaluation before starting project work.
- Construction vehicles and equipment used for this project shall be maintained in good working order to minimize pollutant emissions.
- 4) If ground disturbing activities occur during construction, the Recipient will monitor ground disturbance and if any potential archeological resources are discovered. If any archaeological material is discovered during project work; work in the area shall cease immediately and the Recipient will contact the State Historical Preservation Officer (SHPO), the Department of Homeland Security/FEMA Region IV Environmental Officer and the Divisions' State Environmental Liaison Officer for further guidance.

D. Programmatic

- 1) The funding provided by the Division under this subgrant is only intended to pay for the materials, labor and fees for the installation of hardening activities as a retrofit measure for the Recipient's structure to reduce and/or mitigate the damage that might otherwise occur from severe weather or other hazards. The funding of this project by the Division in no way confers or implies any warranty of use or suitability for the modifications made or installed. The State of Florida disclaims all warranties with regard to this mitigation project, express or implied, including but not limited to, any implied warranties and/or conditions of satisfactory quality and fitness for a particular purpose, merchantability, or merchantable quality
- 2) If the Recipient is not the current title holder of the affected property, the Recipients must provide documentation confirming the property acquisition and easement rights were obtained voluntarily. If condemnation or eminent domain is used to obtain easement rights, FEMA will not pay for any associated costs or payments to the property owner. Furthermore, FEMA will not consider it an eligible contribution to the non-Federal cost share requirement and will not financially participate in that component of a project if land or easements are obtained involuntarily.
- A change in the scope of work MUST be approved by the Division and FEMA in advance regardless
 of the budget implications.
- 4) The Recipient must notify the Division as soon as significant developments becomes known, such as delays or adverse conditions that might raise costs or delay completion, or favorable conditions allowing lower costs or earlier completion.
- 5) The Recipient must "obtain prior written approval for any budget revision which would result in a need for additional funds" [44 CFR 13(c)], from the Division and FEMA.
- 6) Any extension of the Period of Performance must be submitted to FEMA, 60 days prior to the expiration date. Therefore, any request for a Period of Performance Extension must be in writing and submitted along with substantiation of new expiration date, and a new schedule of work, to the Division a minimum of seventy (70) days prior to the expiration date, for Division processing to FEMA.
- The Recipient must avoid duplication of benefits between the HMGP and any other form of assistance, as required by Section 312 of the Stafford Act, and further clarification in 44 CFR 206.191.

E. Financial Consequences:

- if the Recipient fails to comply with any term of the award, the Division shall take one or more of the following actions, as appropriate in the circumstances:
 - a) Temporarily withhold cash payments pending correction of the deficiency by the Recipient;
 - b) Disallow all or part of the cost of the activity or action not in compliance;
 - c) Wholly or partly suspend or terminate the current award for the Recipient's program;
 - d) Withhold further awards for the program; or
 - e) Take other remedies that may be legally available.
