A RESOLUTION OF THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA ACCEPTING THE RECOMMENDATIONS OF THE HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES ADVISORY COUNCIL TO EXTEND EXISTING FUNDING AGREEMENTS WITH NONPROFIT AGENCIES FOR FISCAL YEAR 2016-2017.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, each year St Johns County provides funding to nonprofit agencies that provide health, human, or social services to the residents of St Johns County; and

WHEREAS, the St. Johns County Health and Human Services Advisory Council (HHSAC) has submitted its funding recommendations to the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners for fiscal year 2016 to extend contracts approved at the October 6, 2015 Board meeting; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners wishes to accept the funding recommendations submitted by the HHSAC; and

WHEREAS, the previously executed contracts set forth the terms and conditions of the agreements with each of the nonprofit agencies; and

WHEREAS, the Board of County Commissioners has reviewed the terms, conditions and requirements of the current agreements and determined that extending the agreements for an additional one-year term serves the interests of the citizens of St. Johns County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA:

Section 1. Incorporation of Recitals.

The above recitals are hereby incorporated into the body of this resolution, and are adopted as findings of fact.

Section 2. Acceptance of Recommendations.

The Board accepts the funding recommendations submitted by the HHSAC for Fiscal Year 2016-2017, attached hereto and incorporated herein, and authorizes the County Administrator, or his designee, to extend the current agreements for an additional one-year term as provided in the HHSAC recommendation.

further action by the Board of County Commissioners.

Section 4. Effective Date.

This resolution shall be effective upon its adoption by the Board.
