

RESOLUTION NO. 2018- 230

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE SHERIFF, OR DESIGNEE, TO SUBMIT AN APPLICATION SEEKING FUNDING ASSISTANCE THROUGH THE FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF LAW ENFORCEMENT FEDERAL FISCAL YEAR 2018 EDWARD BYRNE MEMORIAL JUSTICE ASSISTANCE GRANT (JAG), STATE SOLICITATION, AND AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO EXECUTE A CERTIFICATE OF PARTICIPATION ON BEHALF OF THE COUNTY.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement anticipates an award from the United States Department of Justice through the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Formula Program: State Solicitation, in the amount of \$59,814 for St. Johns County; and

WHEREAS, JAG funded projects may be used by St. Johns County local units of government to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime and to improve the criminal justice system.; and

WHEREAS, the St. Johns County Sheriff's Office, together with the City of St. Augustine Police Department, and City of St. Augustine Beach Police Department, are requesting to use the grant funding for equipment totaling \$59,814; and

WHEREAS, the FDLE requires the Board of County Commissioners to authorize their acceptance through a Certificate of Participation; and

WHEREAS, after a review of the Grant announcement materials, the County has determined that nothing contained in the Grant application negatively impacts the interests of the County; and

NOW, THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida that:

Section 1. The above Recitals are incorporated by reference into the body of this Resolution, and such Recitals are adopted as Findings of Fact.

Section 2. The Board of County Commissioners hereby approves and authorizes the Sheriff of St. Johns County, Florida, or his designee, to submit an application seeking funding assistance through the Florida Department of Law Enforcement Federal Fiscal Year 2017-18 Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) and to execute any other paperwork necessary to, or associated with, the grant application.

Section 3. The Board of County Commissioners hereby agrees to serve as the coordinating unit of government for JAG and authorizes the Chair to execute the attached Certificate of Participation on behalf of the County.

Section 4. To the extent that there are typographical or administrative errors or omissions that do not change the tone, tenor, or context of this Resolution, this Resolution may be revised without subsequent approval of the Board of County Commissioners.

Dear Byrne JAG Partners:

As you are aware, FDLE submitted Florida's FY17 Byrne JAG application last year and recently received notice of award. Prior to completing the state's certifications required to accept the award, FDLE must first receive the Chief Legal Officer (CLO) certification from local governments that intend to receive funding through our subawards. **FDLE must receive the CLO certification from anticipated local subrecipient jurisdictions in order for Florida's Attorney General to complete the state's CLO certification. Please note this must be signed by the Chief Legal Officer for the unit of government, not by an agency attorney.**

FDLE typically administers each of our Byrne JAG awards via formula allocations in two cycles: JAG-Countywide (JAGC) and JAG-Direct (JAGD). Although we don't usually initiate the JAGD cycle until the JAG-Countywide is complete, it is necessary we begin both simultaneously this year in light of these new certification requirements.

Instructions for submitting the 8 U.S.C. 1373 Certifications

- Each unit of local government must submit both a Chief Legal Officer (CLO) and Chief Executive Officer (CEO) certification to the Office of Criminal Justice Grants in order to receive a subaward. The required certifications may be found [here](#).
 - o **Cities and counties that intend to apply for their FDLE JAG allocation must submit a CLO certification to criminaljustice@fdle.state.fl.us by August 3rd.**

- o The CEO certification will be due to FDLE with the submission of signed application packets.
- o Only one CLO and CEO certification is required from each unit of government. For example, a city receiving a JAGC allocation from the county as well as a JAGD allocation from FDLE will only need to submit one copy of each certification. FDLE will apply them to all applicable subawards and grant programs.
- o Additionally, any local government receiving a FY17 JAG direct award from DOJ that has already completed these certifications for their federal award may forward a copy of the executed certifications to the email address above to satisfy the requirement for their subaward.

For potential JAGC Subrecipients:

- FY17 JAGC allocations were posted on FDLE's Grants Office website last year with instructions for the countywide planning and approval requirements (e.g. the "51% process").
- Counties that have not already submitted the Certificate of Participation to FDLE identifying their County Coordinator should do so by **August 15th**. The County Coordinator will serve as the primary contact for their 51% process and oversee all applications under their allocation.
- Counties that have not already submitted their "51% letters" to FDLE should do so as soon as possible.

For potential JAGD Subrecipients:

- ~~FY17 JAGD allocations are included in the attached funding overview.~~
- ~~A unit of local government that receives a direct award from DOJ's Bureau of Justice Assistance may not also receive a JAGD award from FDLE.~~
- FDLE will provide the SIMON announcement code to each eligible grant contact in the near future. This announcement code is required to submit an application in our grant system.

Thank you again for your understanding and patience as we have worked over the past year to communicate the impacts these delays have had on us, our state, and our local partners. Your cooperation with this process is appreciated, and I apologize for the quick turnaround on the request for CLO's. We will continue to keep you updated on the status of these funds.
