# **RECITALS**

WHEREAS, the Florida Department of Law Enforcement anticipates an award from the United States Department of Justice through the Edward Byrne Memorial Justice Assistance Grant (JAG) Formula Program: State Solicitation, in the amount of \$61,164 for St. Johns County; and

WHEREAS, JAG funded projects may be used by St. Johns County local units of government to support a broad range of activities to prevent and control crime and to improve the criminal justice system.; and

## **Problem Identification**

St. Augustine, located in Northeast Florida, is the largest municipality in St. Johns County. The County has a population of over 290,000 and its 608 square miles is bounded by the Atlantic Ocean on the east, the St. Johns River on the west, and bisected by the San Sebastian River. The I-95 corridor, U. S. 1 and A-1-A all traverse north-south through the St. John's County, which is immediately south of Duval County.

St. Augustine, is known not only for its location close to beaches and tourist- related businesses and amenities, but also for it's vibrant Historic District and many attractions, all rich in Florida history.

Current statistics show that the county is among the ten fastest growing areas in the State of Florida as well as in the nation. With this type of rapid growth, the need for a new approach to dealing with criminal offenders is even more imperative.

With a decade of decreasing crime rates, the City of St. Augustine has become a highly desirable place to live and work. In order to insure the safety of its citizens and tourists it is necessary for the Police Department to continue to improve the delivery of police service.

On the 25th of July, the Florida Cabinet voted to buy 57 acres of pristine waterfront property In St. Augustine. The monies to purchase the property will come from the Forever Florida Trust Fund, the North Florida Land Trust and the City of St. Augustine. This is the largest parcel of undeveloped waterfront property in the City of St. Augustine. This unique opportunity also has provided The St Augustine Police Dept. with a challenging security issue to resolve.

The City approached both the National and State Park services about administering the property; both declined to take on that responsibility. The city envisions creating a large wilderness park with both hiking and bike trails and other amenities. With this decision the City must also provide for security and the protection of visitors.

With the funds available in the grant the Department believes that utilizing them to buy new equipment is the best way to resolve this new security issue.

# **Project Summary (Scope of Work)**

This situation will provide a major challenge for the St. Augustine Police Department which will have to provide the security and protection to visitors to the park throughout the year. In order to meet that challenge the Department believes that the best use of this year?s grant with be to purchase an all-terrain vehicle (ATV) which can be utilized to patrol the hiking paths and trails in the newly acquired park.
