## RESOLUTION NO. 2020- 78

A RESOLUTION BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, APPROVING AND AUTHORIZING THE SUBMITTAL OF THE STATE HOUSING INITIATIVE PARTNERSHIP (SHIP) ANNUAL REPORT FOR STATE FISCAL YEARS 2016-2017, 2017-2018, AND 2018-2019 TO THE FLORIDA HOUSING FINANCE CORPORATION; AUTHORIZING THE CHAIR TO SIGN THE NECESSARY CERTIFICATIONS ACCEPTING THE REPORT; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

#### RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Florida Housing Finance Corporation requires the review of the County Comptroller for accuracy; and

WHEREAS, the report has been reviewed and gained approval by the County Comptroller; and

**WHEREAS,** St. Johns County wishes to comply with statutory requirements of the SHIP program in order to ensure the ability to receive future funding.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF ST. JOHNS COUNTY:

#### **Support Services**

Emergency Services and Homeless Coalition provides transitional housing for qualifying individuals and families.

Alpha-Omega Miracle Home provides housing, counseling and education for homeless single mothers, their children and senior women.

Habitat for Humanity provides homeownership opportunities for qualifying low and very low income families. Betty Griffin Houses provides protection and services for victims of domestic violence and/or victims of sexual assault.

St. Johns County Social Services Department provides emergency rents and deposits to prevent or eliminate homelessness. Also, provide utility assistance to SJC residents in crisis; payments made directly to utility company.

St. Francis House Homeless Shelter provides temporary and emergency shelter for homeless individuals and families.

Northeast Community Acton Agency stabilizes and empowers vulnerable families to achieve self-sufficiency through education, employment, and advocacy.

St. Johns Housing Partnership administers various private and public funding sources to provide home repairs to elderly, disabled, and low income households.

United Way 211 provides information and referrals to individuals and families in crisis.

#### Other Accomplishments

St Johns County has developed public/private partnerships and engagement to identify and address community needs. The County continues to advocate for the needs of its most vulnerable populations.

The CWHIP program provides homeownership opportunities to work force and essential services personnel and produced 95 single family homes over an 8 year period.

On August 8, 2018 the St. Johns County Continuum of Care worked with the St Johns County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) to direct staff to initiate the exploration of an affordable housing initiative that will be presented to the board in 2019. (http://www.staugustine.com/news/20180804/county-commissioners-asked-to-give-nod-to-proposed-affordable-housing-solution)

Staff also received permission from the BCC to move forward with an equitable program that distributes properties owned by St. Johns County for the purpose of development of affordable housing.

On July 27,2018 the St. Johns County AHAC and HFA hosted a joint meeting that served as a seminar to discuss the need for affordable housing and some of the impediments to developing it in St Johns County.

St. Johns County AHAC continues to meet and discuss affordable housing despite not be mandated to do so by statue.

#### **Availability for Public Inspection and Comments**

On August 8, 2018 the St. Johns County Continuum of Care worked with the St Johns County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) to direct staff to initiate the exploration of an affordable housing initiative that will be presented to the board in 2019. (http://www.staugustine.com/news/20180804/county-commissioners-asked-to-give-nod-to-proposed-affordable-housing-solution) These discussions have been on-going and continue to be part of a larger community conversation about affordable housing.

St. Johns County AHAC has continued to meet and discuss affordable housing despite not be mandated to do so by statue. On November 20 and December 17, 2019 the St. Johns County Affordable Housing Advisory Committee will hold a pair of public hearings to discuss affordable housing, incentives associated with the Local Housing Assistance Plan (SHIP), as well as some of the impediments to developing affordable housing in St Johns County.

St. Johns County continues to utilize a number of grants and partnerships to maximize the development of affordable housing as well as provide housing to those at risk of homelessness.

The Housing Department also looks to prioritize the funding of projects that assist individuals in the alleviation of homelessness through the use of Land Acquisition-Rental Strategy.
