RECITALS

WHEREAS, the Infrastructure Investment and Jobs Act ("IIJA") authorizes a range of competitive funding opportunities for local government infrastructure projects; and

WHEREAS, the Safe Streets for All program and Railroad Crossing Elimination program are authorized under the IIJA; and

WHEREAS, staff have identified projects on the Capital Improvement Plan that may align with the programs; and

WHEREAS, the application period for the grants is anticipated in the first two quarters of calendar year 2023; and

WHEREAS, none of the requirements, restrictions, and/or obligations associated with the award of a grant under either of the programs would negatively impact the interests of the County; and

WHEREAS, applying for grants under these programs serves the overall interest of the County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida that:

Section 1. The above recitals are hereby incorporated into the body of this resolution and are adopted as findings of fact.

Section 2. The County Administrator, or designee, is authorized on behalf of the County to submit grant applications for the Safe Streets for All program and the Railroad Crossing Elimination program.

Section 3. To the extent that there are typographical or administrative errors that do not change the tone, tenor, or concept of this resolution, this resolution may be revised without subsequent approval by the Board of County Commissioners.

Section 4. This resolution shall be effective upon adoption by the Board of County Commissioners.

The Federal Railroad Administration supports the nation's rail network through a variety of competitive and dedicated grant programs designed to improve highway-rail grade crossing safety and improve the mobility of people and goods.

The Railroad Crossing Elimination grant program is a new grant program enacted in Section 22305 of the Bipartisan Infrastructure Law.
