JOHNS COUNTY, FLORIDA, PROVIDING FOR PARTICIPATION IN THE COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT (CDBG) PROGRAM; RECOGNIZING AND APPROPRIATING \$1,143,988.00 FROM **DEPARTMENT** OF HOUSING AND DEVELOPMENT; APPROVING THE FISCAL YEAR 2024-2025 ANNUAL ACTION PLAN; AUTHORIZING THE AWARD OF GRANT **FUNDS** TO SUBRECIPIENTS; **PROVIDING** AUTHORIZATION FOR REALLOCATION OF GRANT FUNDS AS MORE PARTICULARLY DESCRIBED PROVIDING FOR THE COUNTY ADMINISTRATOR, OR HER DESIGNEE, TO EXECUTE AND DELIVER DOCUMENTS RELATED TO THE AWARD; PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

RECITALS

WHEREAS, the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) annually awards Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds to local governments on a formula basis that the local government may, in turn, award to qualified organizations to implement the CDBG program; and

WHEREAS, the goals and objectives of the CDBG program are aimed at developing viable urban communities by providing decent affordable housing and a suitable living environment and associated supportive services to the most vulnerable in our communities, creating jobs through the expansion and retention of businesses, and expanding economic opportunities, principally for low and moderate-income persons and families; and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County is expected to receive \$1,143,988.00 in CDBG funds from HUD on or about October 1, 2024; and

WHEREAS, St. Johns County Health and Human Services, Housing and Community Development Department ("Department") is responsible for making recommendations on all CDBG grant funding awards made to qualified recipients for community development and affordable housing initiatives and related programs and services; and

WHEREAS, the Department has completed its 2024-2025 application process and has recommended award of CDBG grant funding to various entities, projects, and programs described

in the 2024-2025 Annual Action Plan attached hereto as **Exhibit 1** and incorporated herein by this reference; now, therefore

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of County Commissioners of St. Johns County, Florida:

- **Section 1**. The above Recitals are incorporated into the body of this Resolution and are adopted as findings of fact.
- **Section 2**. There is hereby appropriated for the 2024-2025 fiscal year, within the County's budget, the sum of \$1,143,988.00 in CDBG program grant funds, for distribution to various award subrecipients selected for community development and affordable housing initiatives and related programs and services and to other County departments as appropriate.
- **Section 3.** The County Administrator, or her designee, is hereby authorized to execute and deliver, on behalf of the County, the HUD Funding Agreement, and all other applications, certificates, and documents necessary for the award.
- **Section 4.** The County Administrator, or her designee, is hereby authorized to execute and deliver subrecipient agreements, and any subsequent amendments thereto, in accordance with the awards identified in the 2024-2025 Annual Action Plan.
- **Section 5.** In the event a subrecipient cannot accept an award of CDBG funds, or additional funds are made available, the Department may reallocate funds using the same method and criteria normally applied by the Department for the award of CDBG funds, without further action by the Board, providing such award does not require a substantial amendment to the annual action plan.
- **Section 6**. If HUD approves a different allocation of CDBG grant funds than is appropriated by this Resolution, then the County Administrator shall submit a supplementary request to the Board for approval in accordance with the actual allocation received.
- **Section 7**. To the extent there are typographical, administrative, or scrivener's errors that do not change the tone, tenor, or context of this Resolution, this Resolution may be revised without further action by the Board of County Commissioners.
 - **Section 8**. This Resolution shall become effective immediately upon adoption.

Executive Summary

1. Introduction

St. Johns County is rich in history and opportunity. Nestled between the St. Johns River and the Atlantic Coast, it is a fast-growing community home to over 200,000 residents. The growing diversity in population, arts, commerce, industries, and it is becoming a leading County to live, work, and play.

As an entitlement jurisdiction under the United States Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), St. Johns County receives federal funds from the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) based on the in-population size, concentration of poverty, and socioeconomic and demographic data. Every year, HUD requires entitlement communities like St. Johns County to develop and submit an Annual Action (AAP). St. Johns County's 2021-2025 Consolidated Plan is carried out through its Annual Action Plan, which provides a concise summary of the actions, activities, and specific federal and non-federal resources that will be used annually to address the priority needs and specific goals identified by the 2021-2025 Consolidated Plan.

As approved by HUD, the County's 2021-2025 Consolidated Plan identified and analyzed community, social, and economic needs, especially within low to moderate-income (LMI) communities, and established multi-year goals to address those needs. Goals and strategies analyzing housing and community development needs and analyzing housing and economic market conditions and available resources.

Like the 2021-2025 Consolidated Planning process, the Annual Action Plan process is collaborative, and through this collaboration with community members, nonprofit organizations, social service agencies, and other key stakeholders establishes comprehensive, strategic, and collaborative goals to improve, address, and encourage growth within the County.

Beyond a requirement to comply with federal regulation, the Annual Action Plan provides an opportunity for the County to engage with residents and key stakeholders to assess the needs of our community and shape community development, housing, and economic development programs and strategies to respond to the need.

As an entitlement community, St. Johns County is expected to receive an annual allocation of CDBG funds. While adhering to all applicable federal regulations, the County must utilize this funding opportunity to address community needs regarding affordable housing, as well as community and economic development objectives over the next one-year period.

The Annual Action Plan, mandated by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD), outlines the County's affordable housing and community development needs and identifies strategies for addressing them.

2. Summarize the objectives and outcomes identified in the Plan

St. Johns County deployed a comprehensive community engagement campaign along with data provided by the American Community Survey (ACS), Comprehensive Housing Affordability Strategy (CHAS) Data, and Community Planning and Development Mapping Services to create the footprint for this Annual Action Plan. Federal regulations require that Community Development Block Grant funds primarily low- and moderate-income persons in accordance with the following HUD objectives:

- 1. Provide decent housing;
- 2. Establish and maintain a suitable living environment; and
- 3. Provide expanded economic opportunities.

These objectives are combined with three performance outcomes categories and measurement statements:

- 1. Accessibility;
- 2. Affordability, and
- 3. Sustainability.

St. Johns County has identified various activities they intend to utilize to achieve the objectives and associated outcomes required by HUD. The County intends to focus investments on the following eligible areas:

1. Public Facilities and Infrastructure

- 2. Public Services
- 3. Affordable Housing and Homeless Services
- 4. Home Repair
- 5. Economic Development

St. Johns County will implement and comply with new construction requirements, requiring more than \$250,000 in funding, such as Buy America Build America Act (BABAA). This regulation entitles recipients of an award of Federal financial assistance from a program for infrastructure to be notified that none of the funds provided under this award may be used for a project for infrastructure unless: (1) all iron and steel used in the project are produced in the United States—this means all manufacturing processes, from the initial melting stage through the application of coatings, occurred in the United States; (2) all manufactured products used in the project are produced in the United States—this means the manufactured product was manufactured in the United States; and the cost of the components of the manufactured product that are mined, produced, or manufactured in the United States is greater than 55 percent of the total cost of all components of the manufactured product, unless another standard for determining the minimum amount of domestic content of the manufactured product has been established under applicable law or regulation; and (3) all construction materials are manufactured in the United States—this means that all manufacturing processes for the construction material occurred in the United States

3. Evaluation of past performance

St. Johns County first became an entitlement community for the 2016-2020 Consolidated Plan cycle. Staff worked remarkably hard to build out the CDBG Program by developing policies and procedures, cultivating relationships with nonprofit organizations and social service agencies, and other community partners, expanding the funding on eligible activities that were reported on in the CAPERS, envisioning the possibilities of future investments and responding to natural disasters and a global pandemic.

4. Summary of Citizen Participation Process and consultation process

Summary from citizen participation section of plan.

St. Johns County has developed a Citizen Participation Plan (CPP) to guide the public process of developing the Annual Action Plan. Citizen participation was encouraged and solicited in the planning process through advertisements in the local newspaper and on the County website, followed by a 30-day review and comment period. The CPP required no less than two public hearings to gather citizen input on housing and community development programs funded by the CDBG program. The County sought public participation and input as outlined in the CPP and as follows:

- Held public hearings in association with the Board of County Commissioners regularly scheduled meetings.
- Held five (5) public hearings during the planning process. The schedule of these meetings was published in the local newspaper and posted on the County website.
- An electronic survey was created to gather citizen and stakeholder input to help
 determine what programs/projects should be funded. The survey was published on the
 County website, and notice of the survey was published in the local newspaper. Paper
 copies of the survey were available at various County locations and during community
 meetings.
- Staff met with stakeholders and community members and attended local meetings to educate citizens on the planning process and to encourage citizen participation and input.
- A draft copy of the Annual Action Plan was made available to the public for a 30-day review and comment period. It was introduced during an advertised public hearing.

5. Summary of public comments

Public comments were received at the public hearings, and many of our residents and key stakeholders participated in our survey (all responses can be referenced in the attached document). The overwhelming majority of public comments emphasize the urgent requirement for affordable housing, public infrastructure, and public services in underserved areas. The surveys are attached for review, with key areas being supported for homelessness, funding for small businesses, home repairs for people with special needs, including the elderly, people with disabilities, and veterans, improved public safety, cost of living, support for disabled veterans,

roadways and sidewalks in poor repair, upgrades to parks and recreational facilities, and public transportation.

6. Summary of comments or views not accepted and the reasons for not accepting them

All public comments were accepted and considered consistent with the 5-year Consolidated Plan and activities that address social services, housing, and community-based infrastructures. The survey was available to all residents, internal and external social agencies, planning, transportation, parts and recreations, and other stakeholders.

7. Summary

St. Johns County values and encourages the input and participation of its citizens, stakeholders, and community members affected by or involved with any housing and community development projects. By utilizing the citizen participation process and consulting with public service providers, advisory committees, other County departments, and community development corporations, the County gathered valuable feedback that helped identify the goals and objectives in the Plan. The County will leverage its CDBG funds with other federal, state, local, and private dollars to meet the goals and objectives discussed in the Annual Action Plan.

1. Introduction

St. Johns County is committed to considering resident input for the development of the PY2024 Annual Action Plan for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development. Residents, especially low-income or potentially marginalized residents in LMI areas, are strongly encouraged to participate in the Survey and public hearings. County staff, officials, and consultants met with many groups, committees, departments, and organizations to encourage public participation in identifying housing and community development needs.

The meeting details were published on our website and local media outlets for at least fifteen (15) days prior and the survey was published on our website via Survey Monkey and made available in paper form for over thirty (30) days. There were also five in-person public meetings, during which hard copies of the survey were provided.

Public comment is also encouraged when the document is in the draft stage. All public input is considered and made a part of the Plan. All comments received verbally or in writing will be accepted.

The County coordinates with many different organizations and service providers, including, but not limited to:

Email communications, interagency meetings (Zoom and in-person), conference calls, and consultations with St. Johns County Social Services, Flagler Hospital/UF Health Office of Care Connect in St. Johns County, Salvation Army, Home Again (Non-profit agency serving the homeless in St. Johns County) and others. Staff also attended annual Fair Housing Trainings.

Describe coordination with the Continuum of Care and efforts to address the needs of homeless persons (particularly chronically homeless individuals and families, families with children, veterans, and unaccompanied youth) and persons at risk of homelessness.

At present, the Lead Agency is Flagler Health. In our shared goal of ending homelessness within our community, County staff, and elected officials have regular contact with the Continuum of Care (CoC) to ensure the coordination of meaningful goals. Staff attend the CoC meetings, and one (1) staff member sits on the CoC Board.

In efforts to coordinate and share data, the Homeless Management Information System (HMIS) provides a higher standard of collecting client-level data. for the critical populations that are being served daily. The populations being affected cross race, color, nationality, sex, religion, and disability of individuals and families who are experiencing homelessness or at risk of becoming homeless.

Describe consultation with the Continuum(s) of Care that serves the jurisdiction's area in determining how to allocate ESG funds, develop performance standards for and evaluate outcomes of projects and activities assisted by ESG funds, and develop funding, policies and procedures for the operation and administration of HMIS

Substantial consultation with the St. Johns County area homeless service providers and clients is essential for collecting data and creating meaningful outcomes for individuals and families. To fully address the needs of the homeless members of our community, County staff have regular contact with the CoC. This involves ESG allocation's performance standards, evaluation of outcomes, and the development of funding, policies, and procedures for the administration of HMIS. This ongoing communication and collaboration centered on strategic goals as part of the Annual Action Plan development process and will continue even upon the completion, submission, and approval of the PY2024 Annual Action Plan.

The County does not receive a direct allocation of ESG from HUD but rather applies for funding from the State. ESG is designed to support the first steps in homeless prevention and assist people experiencing homelessness to transition toward safe and healthy living situations. ESG funds can be used by emergency shelter operators and other service providers for activities such as street outreach, homelessness prevention, rapid re-housing, and data collection.

The County believes housing is a human right, and we envision a community where all people have access to safe, stable, and affordable housing.

Rationale for the priorities for allocating investments geographically

The County has established priorities and allocations based on citizen and stakeholder input and Census data trends. The County intends to invest the funds in communities identified as areas of greatest need with the potential for positive changes in the lives of our residents. To comply with CDBG program requirements, at least 70% of funds benefit low- and moderate-income households. Most funding will be used for infrastructure and public facilities that support expanding public safety and the creation/preservation of existing housing units in LMI areas to address housing affordability for our most vulnerable households and social services/public services to meet non-housing needs.

Discussion

St. Johns County benefits from serving urban, suburban, and rural areas within the county lines. Each of these different community types means our residents have various choices in living, working, and playing places. However, the varying non-financial resources in each area also present challenges when trying to address the diverse needs of our residents. Citizen and stakeholder input prioritized the different ends and geographical areas.

Affordable Housing

Discussion

St. Johns County is committed to increasing the affordable housing available to our residents. For this PY 2024, SJC will not invest any CDBG funding and instead will focus its \$3.4 million of SHIP funds on furthering the affordable housing needs within the County. SHIP funds have greater flexibility in addressing a wider range of housing types for incomes ranging up to 140% of the area median income. SHIP funds may be used to fund emergency repairs, new

construction, rehabilitation, down payment and closing cost assistance, impact fees, construction financing, acquisition of property for affordable housing, matching dollars for federal housing grants and programs, and homeownership counseling for all housing and household types. With the 3.4 million, we estimate to work on up to 37 homes; additionally, through CDBG, we will be working on infrastructure to provide the necessary utilities to help support housing creation in our next fiscal year.

St. Johns County realizes that current housing market conditions present many barriers to affordable housing. The County continues implementing policies and strategies to maintain and provide affordable housing inventory for residents.

Actions it planned to remove or ameliorate the negative effects of public policies that serve as barriers to affordable housing such as land use controls, tax policies affecting land, zoning ordinances, building codes, fees and charges, growth limitations, and policies affecting the return on residential investment

The St. Johns County Comprehensive Plan 2010-2025 Housing Element states that its purpose is to support the provision and maintenance of an adequate inventory of decent, safe, and sanitary housing in a variety of types, sizes, and locations throughout the County at affordable costs to meet the needs of the current and future residents of St Johns County. The Plan provides several objectives as listed below:

- Continue the housing implementation policies such as density bonuses, infill housing, and an expedited development review process for affordable workforce housing developments.
- Maintaining existing programs, investigating new programs, and identifying funding sources to eliminate substandard housing, improve existing houses' aesthetic qualities, and encourage improvements that reduce energy and water consumption.
- Through its Future Land Use Map and its review of the County Land Development Code, shall ensure that County zoning districts include areas for the location of housing for very low-, low- and moderate-income households, single-family households, single-family homes, mobile homes, manufactured homes, group homes and foster care facilities adequate to meet the needs for these housing types during the planning period.
- Continue to implement its existing Land Development Code regulations, which further identify and protect historically significant structures and districts.
- Review all existing codes and ordinances and adopt appropriate regulations that address housing conservation, rehabilitation, or demolition.
- Provide uniform and equitable treatment for persons and businesses displaced by state and local government programs consistent with Section 421.55 F.S.
- Improve and maintain the quality and integrity of its residential communities. Strategies to achieve this include encouraging the development of residential neighborhoods that are sustainable, which provide for networks of interconnected streets for bother pedestrian and

vehicular use, which address aesthetics, architecture, and urban design, and which discourage sprawl; coordinating with local law enforcement agencies to promote programs designed to improve the safety and security of neighborhoods; and encouraging the utilization of environmental design strategies to reduce the potential of crime in neighborhoods.

Discussion:

The County staff and Board of County Commissioners realize that public policies can affect the supply and new construction of affordable housing in our community through the impacts on the cost and geographic location of these types of units. The County is dedicated to ensuring that consideration is given to affordable housing developments in areas with proximity to community resources such as transportation, employment opportunities, and public services that help ensure housing stability for our LMI residents. The County will continue its regular review of existing policies and adjust when needed and appropriate so that they do not impede affordable housing provision. The County acknowledges new policies may be needed as the affordable housing market changes over time.

AP-85 Other Actions – 91.220(k)

Introduction:

St. Johns County strives to address the needs of low- and moderate-income residents, homeless individuals and families, and underserved populations. Most of the County's strategies and actions are done in collaboration with non-profit agencies, municipalities, other organizations, and advisory boards/committees. The following sections outline how the County will address underserved needs and affordable housing, reduce lead-based paint hazards, reduce the number of poverty-level families in the County, and develop an institutional structure to ensure the success of activities aimed at low- and moderate-income persons. It should be noted, however, that this Annual Action Plan is for Year 4 of a 5-year Consolidated Plan, and not all will be fully addressed within the first year.

Actions planned to address obstacles to meeting underserved needs

St. Johns County has oriented our programs toward maintaining affordable housing and meeting the underserved needs of our most vulnerable residents. The largest obstacle is the lack of sufficient resources to fully meet the needs of our community. The County will take the following actions to address those obstacles:

- Promote cooperation between agencies by participating in different coordinating bodies in the county, such as but not limited to the Continuum of Care, the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee, the Health and Human Services Advisory Council, and the Housing Finance Authority
- Assist with the rehabilitation of existing homes, especially for extremely low-income households, elderly, disabled and veterans
- Search and apply for new funding from Federal and/or State sources
- Possibly address infrastructure deficiencies in low to moderate-income areas through CDBG funding

Actions planned to foster and maintain affordable housing

The St. Johns County Affordable Housing Advisory Committee (AHAC) is responsible for reviewing and assessing established policies and procedures, ordinances, and land development regulations, as well as the local government comprehensive plan and recommending specific actions or initiatives to encourage and facilitate affordable housing. The AHAC prepares an annual report, the purpose of which is to include incentives that encourage affordable housing for both rental and homeownership. The AHAC is currently working on the

annual report for 2024. The most recent report contained 12 incentives, many of which are expected to remain in the 2024 report, to promote and encourage affordable housing in St. Johns County.

- The processing of approvals of development orders on permits, as defined in s. 163.3164 (7) and (8) for all affordable housing projects are expedited to a greater degree than other projects
- The modification of impact-fee requirements, including reduction or waiver of fees and alternative methods of fee payment for affordable housing.
- The allowance of flexibility in densities for affordable housing.
- The reservation of infrastructure capacity for housing for very low-income, low-income, and moderate-income persons.
- The allowance of affordable accessory residential units in residential zoning districts.
- The reduction of parking and setback requirements for affordable housing.
- The allowance of flexible lot configurations, including zero-lot-line configurations for affordable housing.
- The modification of street requirements for affordable housing
- The establishment of a process by which a local government considers, before adoption, policies, procedures, ordinances, regulations, or plan provisions that increase the cost of housing.
- The preparation of a printed inventory of locally owned public lands suitable for affordable housing.
- Support development near transportation hubs, major employment centers, and mixed-use development.

Actions planned to reduce lead-based paint hazards

St. Johns County will continue to ensure our residents' affordable housing stock is safe from lead hazards. Program partners distribute "Protecting Your Family from Lead" pamphlets and other actions to address lead-based paint hazards and to increase access to housing without lead-based paint hazards are supported by the Florida Department of Health (DOH) through integrated partnerships and programs administered by local county health departments. Public health programs administered by the DOH-St. Johns County Health Department includes, but is not limited to, the following:

(1) Surveillance and Epidemiology: Tracking and follow-up of reportable conditions such as lead

exposure and case management, including risk screenings and home assessments, as needed.

- (2) Environmental Public Health: Inspection of limited-use drinking water systems and timely water quality monitoring related to lead and other contaminants; environmental health education.
- (3) Public Health Practice and Policy: One of our many community partnerships, the St. Johns County Health Leadership Council convenes the triennial Community Health Assessment (CHA), which uses a formal method to identify key community issues in our community (i.e., safe housing, transportation, etc.) and community health status data (i.e., lead poisoning rates, access to community water systems, etc.). DOH-St. Johns partners with the federally funded Head Start program by serving as a seasonal co-location site to allow for comprehensive screenings (i.e., child development and lead exposure) to children ages 3 to 5.
- (4) Healthy Start (a Maternal and Child Health Program): Registered nurses review screenings of pregnant moms and infants and then, as needed, conduct home visits, which include a safety assessment (i.e., for potential sources of lead exposure) and child developmental screenings. Through the Nurse Case Management Model, those clients living in housing with LBP hazards are provided guidance on how to reduce exposure and, if needed, are provided information on how to access safe housing.
- (5) Community Linkages: Many residents still associate with DOH-St. Johns with primary care services/lab testing services, residents frequently contact our Nurse Triage Call Center for referrals/linkages to lead testing locations within the community.

Actions planned to reduce the number of poverty-level families

St. Johns County is dedicated to supporting a continuum of coordinated outreach efforts and services to enhance the lives of our residents, especially those living below the poverty line. The county works to strengthen neighborhoods and support families and individuals with social service programs, home repair, infrastructure and public facilities, and collaboration with nonprofit partners and other state and local resources and service providers. The programs outlined in the Five-Year 2021-2025 Consolidated Plan are designed to meet the needs of our most vulnerable residents and are tailored to meet immediate, short-term, and long-term goals.

The St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners (BCC) governs and establishes the County's poverty-reducing goals and policies. Based on the direction received by the BCC leadership, the County departments are responsible for collaborating and administering

Annual Action Plan

poverty-reducing programs. Coordination between departments is facilitated through collaborative planning efforts, participation on coordinating bodies, and program-specific partnerships. St Johns County has overall objectives and policies in the Comprehensive Plan that are geared toward poverty reduction.

Objective C.1.1 is for the "Creation and Preservation of Affordable Workforce and Special Needs Housing.", Objective C.1.2 states that "The County shall maintain its existing programs, investigate new programs and identify funding sources which will work toward the elimination of substandard housing and improve the aesthetic qualities of existing housing and encourage improvements that reduce energy and water consumption" which supports many of the needs identified in the community survey. Objective C.1.3 ensures "Adequate Areas for Very-Low-, Low- and Moderate-Income Households, Mobile Homes, Manufactured Homes, Group Homes, and Foster Care Facilities." The BCC has also prioritized incorporating energy-efficient building practices through the permitting and approval process, which will ultimately reduce energy costs for LMI households living in these homes. In addition to the above, the County will continue to:

- Upgrade the Community Redevelopment Area (CRA) Housing Stock, which
 predominantly provides for low-income persons, and continue its efforts to develop
 low-to moderate-income rental housing stock.
- Inventory all surplus County-owned land, foreclosed properties, and in-fill opportunities that could be used to promote affordable housing provision and production.
- Strategically work with developers seeking to develop affordable housing projects close to major employment centers and available amenities.
- The County will also continue its Ten-Year Plan to End Homelessness in St. Johns County.

Actions planned to develop institutional structure

The leadership of St. Johns County begins with the Board of County Commissioners and filters through a variety of departments working collaboratively to meet the varied needs of our residents and businesses. A number of public and private agencies within the County participate year-round in providing housing, public services, economic development services, homeless services, and other community development activities, including capital improvements, public facilities, and infrastructure. The County also has several groups that collaborate continually to lobby for resources to alleviate identified gaps within the community. These groups include but are not limited to The Health and Human Services Advisory Council (HHSAC), Health Leadership Council, Behavioral Health Consortium, Continuum of Care (CoC), Housing Finance Authority (HFA), and the Affordable Housing

Advisory Committee (AHAC). Each of these groups has representatives from various agencies that provide services for the institutional delivery system within the county. Communication between agencies is frequent, goal-oriented, and aimed at resolving needs and gaps identified within the County.

Actions planned to enhance coordination between public and private housing and social service agencies

St. Johns County will continue strengthen its relationships by partnering with public and private housing and social service agencies to address the housing and community development needs of low- and moderate-income residents. The County actively participates in the CoC, the Health and Human Services Advisory Council, the Affordable Housing Advisory Committee, the Housing Finance Authority, and other committees that coordinate with service providers, private organizations, and other stakeholders. The County will also continue to fund non-profit organizations that provide social services and housing facilities to needy residents.

Discussion:

St. Johns County is committed to meeting the needs of our underserved residents and making our County a great place to live, work, and play. This includes efforts to affirmatively further fair housing in our community so that all residents feel welcome and valued members of our community.

In all other cases where ESG funds are used for renovation, the recipient will maintain the building as a shelter for homeless individuals and families for a minimum of 3 years after the date the building is first occupied by a homeless individual or family after the completed renovation.

Essential Services and Operating Costs – In the case of assistance involving shelter operations or essential services related to street outreach or emergency shelter, the recipient will provide services or shelter to homeless individuals and families for the period during which the ESG assistance is provided, without regard to a particular site or structure, so long the recipient serves the same type of persons (e.g., families with children, unaccompanied youth, disabled individuals, or victims of domestic violence) or persons in the same geographic area.

Renovation — Any renovation carried out with ESG assistance shall be sufficient to ensure that the building involved is safe and sanitary.

Supportive Services – The recipient will assist homeless individuals in obtaining permanent housing, appropriate supportive services (including medical and mental health treatment, victim services, counseling, supervision, and other services essential for achieving independent living), and other Federal State, local, and private assistance available for these individuals.

Matching Funds - The recipient will obtain matching amounts required under 24 CFR 576.201.

Confidentiality – The recipient has established and is implementing procedures to ensure the confidentiality of records pertaining to any individual provided family violence prevention or treatment services under any project assisted under the ESG program, including protection against the release of the address or location of any family violence shelter project, except with the written authorization of the person responsible for the operation of that shelter.

Homeless Persons Involvement – To the maximum extent practicable, the recipient will involve, through employment, volunteer services, or otherwise, homeless individuals and families in constructing, renovating, maintaining, and operating facilities assisted under the ESG program, in providing services assisted under the ESG program, and in providing services for occupants of facilities assisted under the program.

Consolidated Plan – All activities the recipient undertakes with assistance under ESG are consistent with its consolidated plan.

Discharge Policy — The recipient will establish and implement, to the maximum extent practicable and where appropriate, policies and protocols for the discharge of persons from publicly funded institutions or systems of care (such as health care facilities, mental health facilities, foster care or other youth facilities, or correction programs and institutions) in order to prevent this discharge from immediately resulting in homelessness for these persons.

The Federal Fiscal year begins on October 1; however, CDBG funds are usually unavailable to the County until November or December because the Board unavailable to the county until November of December because the Board must approve County Commissioners' grant agreements, which may delay the award by approximately two to three months. All CDBG awards are made on a reimbursement basis; therefore, the County cannot reimburse a sub-recipient for any expenses incurred before the execution of a grant agreement and the issuance of a notice to proceed with the project.

Congratulations! I am pleased to give you formal notice of your jurisdiction's Fiscal Year 2024 (FY24) allocations for the Office of Community Planning and Development's (CPD) formula programs. Your jurisdiction's FY24 available amounts are as follows:

Community Development Block Grant (CDBG)

\$1,143,988.00

These grant funds provide the financial tools to support low-to-moderate income individuals, families, and communities to address homelessness, affordable housing challenges, aging infrastructure, and economic hardships. CPD is committed to being your partner throughout the process of using these funds. Our local office will assist in finalizing grant agreements, offer technical assistance, training when needed, monitor and implement grant funds for eligible projects in a timely manner. The Department of Housing and Urban Development will work with your team to ensure proper reporting in the Integrated Disbursement and Information System to improve performance data on how these programs are benefitting and touching people's lives, build trust with stakeholder groups, Congress, and amplify the success stories that you and your jurisdiction are able to accomplish with these vital resources.

In addition, you also have \$644,940 in available Section 108 borrowing authority based on your CDBG allocation and outstanding Section 108 balances as of May 14, 2024. Since Section 108 loans are federally guaranteed, this allows your jurisdiction to borrow up to five times of your current CDBG allocation to access loan capital for larger projects at a low interest rate. HUD encourages you to consider using this CDBG multiplier for high priority housing projects, such as housing rehabilitation and conversion of nonresidential properties to residential uses and mixed-use development. This could help fill gaps left by Congress' cut to the HOME program for FY24.

As you begin to plan for the use of FY24 grant funding, please also consider having strategic conversations with your local team to ensure that existing grants are being maximized to meet your local priorities and community needs. A few questions that you might consider asking:

• What were our goals in our most recent Consolidated Plan? How did our commitments in FY23 and previous Action Plans support those goals?

- Do we have any expiring funds? Are there plans to use our funding from past years before the end of the period of performance?
- What, if any, findings have HUD / the Office of Inspector General made against our jurisdiction in the last five years? What have we done to address those findings?

The combination of higher mortgage interest rates, limited for-sale housing inventory, and high home prices has created a challenging environment for homebuyers – particularly low-income families seeking to purchase their first home. In preparing the annual action plan for your jurisdiction's CPD formula funds, we urge you to consider how your HOME Program and other funds may be used to increase the supply of modestly priced housing or provide direct purchase assistance to low-income families seeking to buy a home.

The timely expenditure of your previous year funds is critical to mitigate risks of recapture. If your community's priorities have changed, you have an opportunity to repurpose funding. Our team can work with you to ensure that funds are fully utilized and reach the populations intended by these programs. Please contact our Field Office to learn more.


