Motion by McClure, seconded by Bennett, carried 5/0, to approve the Regular Agenda, as amended.

1. PRESENTATION BY THE PACT PREVENTION COALITION AND YOUTH ADVISORY GROUP

LeAnn Daddario, PACT (Prevention, Advocacy, Choices, and Teamwork) Prevention Coalition, presented a video clip on underage drinking, *Exhibit A*. She said in 2012, St. Johns County was voted the healthiest county in the State of Florida by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation. She said one thing the report did note, was that substance abuse was an issue for St. Johns County. She mentioned there were 14 representatives from all of the high schools in the County, in the Youth Advisory Group, in which a few were present for the meeting.

(9:25 a.m.) The following members of the Youth Advisory Council introduced themselves: Jessica Justice, Gavin Canan, Will Sapp, and Molly Clukey, juniors at St. Augustine High School; Sarah Schreck, junior at Creekside High School; Frank Blumenfeld, junior at Ponte Vedra High School; and Maggie Borngesser, and Jacob Coley, juniors at Bartram Trail High School. Mollie Clukey, Jessica Justice, Gavin Canan, and Will Sapp gave presentations on alcohol and marijuana use, *Exhibit B*.

(9:32 a.m.) Daddario spoke about parents hosting parties at their own homes, civil fines for those parents, and enforcement details. McClure asked about funding, programs for schools, civil fines, and how to educate adults regarding hosting issues. Daddario replied that PACT was currently federally funded, which would end in 18 months. She stated there were State funds that would end in the summer of 2013, and spoke on raising funds for their programs within the County. She spoke on having a

comprehensive campaign, regarding civil fines for adults hosting alcohol parties for individuals under the age of 21.

(9:36 a.m.) Stevenson spoke about being informed, what the existing penalties were for adult hosting alcohol parties for individuals under the age of 21, and working with Teen Drug Court. Daddario said that she believed there were criminal penalties for adult hosting alcohol parties for individuals under the age of 21, but she would have to get back with the Board on the detailed information. She said that in terms of drug court, PACT acted in an advisory capacity.

(9:40 a.m.) Sanchez mentioned that he worked with the PACT Coalition for about six years. He stated there was a County ordinance regarding fining the individuals selling alcohol, and also the license holder, to underage minors. He asked the Attorney's Office to check into the ordinance, and to see if it was enforced. He also mentioned candy flavored tobacco. McCormack mentioned that the County Commission had enacted Ordinance No. 2011-46, which strengthened the local enforcement methods pertaining to the prohibition of sale or service to individuals under 21.

(9:45 a.m.) McCormack said that he could explore the possibility of revisions to the ordinance to cover the social hosting context. Discussion ensued on social hosting and serving alcohol to minors under 21.

(9:46 a.m.) Wanchick spoke about the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation, regarding the scores being low on substance abuse in St. Johns County. He said the County was trying to develop a strategy in conjunction with their partners to address that weakness in their health care system.

2. PUBLIC HEARING - NZVAR 2012-002, CANAL ROAD. THIS IS A REQUEST FOR A NON-ZONING VARIANCE TO SECTION 6.02.01.B.3.A. THIS SECTION STATES THAT EASEMENTS FOR ACCESS TO PUBLIC ROADWAYS SHALL ONLY BE PERMITTED IN MULTI-FAMILY RESIDENTIAL (EXCEPT TOWNHOMES), COMMERCIAL, OR IN NON-PLATTED SUBDIVISIONS. THE SUBJECT LOTS ARE LOCATED WITHIN THE PALM VALLEY SHORES SUBDIVISION, WHICH WAS PLATTED IN 1958. APPLICANT PROPOSES TO EXTEND THE EXISTING ROADWAY APPROXIMATELY 100 FEET TO SERVE LOT 15, AND UTILIZE AN EASEMENT MEETING COUNTY STANDARDS IN ORDER TO ACCESS THE LAST LOT (16) ALONG THE ROADWAY. SUBDIVISION WAS PLATTED WITHOUT ACCESS TO LOT 16. THE AFFECTED OWNERS HAVE ALSO PROVIDED A HOLD HARMLESS AND MAINTENANCE AGREEMENT IN A FORM ACCEPTABLE TO THE COUNTY. THE APPLICANT HAS SUBMITTED AN APPLICATION TO REZONE THE PROPERTY FROM COMMERCIAL TO RESIDENTIAL, AND IF THIS NON-ZONING VARIANCE IS APPROVED; THEY WILL FOLLOW WITH A VARIANCE TO LOT FRONTAGE.

3. DISCUSSION AND REVIEW OF THE COUNTY COMMISSION'S GOALS AND OBJECTIVES

Michael Wanchick, County Administrator, gave the presentation on the St. Johns County Commissions 2013 Goals (Draft), *Exhibit A*.

(9:48 a.m.) Morris said the staff did a great job on the goals.

(9:49 a.m.) Stevenson mentioned covering communities that had infrastructure needs,

and the Board having formal budget documents and objectives. Wanchick said that changes would be made over the following months/years, and that both objectives and infrastructure, would be covered at the March 19, 2013, BCC meeting.

(9:51 a.m.) Bennett and Sanchez said they appreciated the workshop, and thanked the Administrator and staff for all their hard work.

(9:53 a.m.) McClure said they needed a priority list, to see if the priorities would fit into the budget. Wanchick explained that the priorities would unfold at the March 19, 2013, BCC meeting.

(9:55 a.m.) McCormack mentioned that CRA could be added in parentheses behind West Augustine, Flagler Estates and Vilano Beach. Wanchick said they had the amplified wording on the original sheet.

(9:56 a.m.) Motion by Bennett, seconded by Sanchez, carried 5/0, to adopt the St. Johns County Board of County Commissioners 2013 Goals, according to the draft that included the illumination by the administration.

(03/05/13 - 7 - 9:57 a.m.)

4. CONSIDER A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE RULES AND POLICIES OF THE ST. JOHNS COUNTY COMMISSIONERS - RULE 1.405.H PERTAINING TO COUNTY COMMISSIONER USE OF COUNTY VEHICLES

McClure spoke on having vehicles for the commissioners to use.

(10:01 a.m.) Discussion ensued with the Commissioners, regarding the difference between the public and private sector on the use of vehicles, cutting expenses by not having the use of a vehicle, touring the county in personal cars, the County Commissioners being the only ones not having the use of a county vehicle, accumulating travel expenses, and needing more information to review on the subject.

(10:21 a.m.) Motion by McClure, seconded by Bennett, carried 5/0, to table the item to a future workshop session.

03/05/13 - 7 - 10:22 a.m.)

COMMISSIONERS' REPORTS

Commissioner Bennett:

Bennett presented an aerial photograph of the Vilano Bridge floating dock, *Exhibit A*. She spoke about needing a no wake zone in the dock area, to improve the safety of the new floating dock. McCormack said that Bennett had mentioned the issue to them, and they had checked into it.

David Migut, Assistant County Attorney, said under the Florida Statute, the County Attorney's Office could create an ordinance. He said if an ordinance was passed by the Commission, it would have to be sent to the Fish and Wildlife Conservation Commission, and they would have to determine, by substantial and confident evidence, that such ordinance was necessary to protect public safety. McCormack said if the Board would consider the request for the County Attorney's Office to work on an ordinance, they would do so. (10:28 a.m.) *There was consensus of the Board for the County Attorney's Office to work on an ordinance.*

Bennett mentioned that the Board was having a Concurrency Workshop on March 26, 2013.

Bennett said she attended the City of St. Augustine Beach meeting, and the Sheriff's Office 29th Annual Awards Banquet.

Bennett mentioned that the St. Johns County Fire Rescue Marine Rescue Division was chosen as the beach patrol of the year by the Florida Beach Patrol Chief's Association.

Bennett announced there was a Regional Bicycle Pedestrian Plan update for the strategic plan on March 6, 2013, at 4:00 p.m., in the Elcazar Room downtown.

Bennett mentioned attending the ribbon cutting for the new bridge on US 1, and the Career Academy Program.

(10:33 a.m.) Commissioner Sanchez:

Sanchez spoke on the no wake issue about broadening the boundaries.

Sanchez mentioned attending the Sheriff's Office Award Banquet, Veterans Nursing Home Ceremony, and a Sister City's meeting.

Sanchez spoke about the problems that the Hastings Library had incurred. He said since the County did not own the property, they could not apply for grants to help with the maintenance of the library. He said it would cost \$350,000 to repair the building the library currently occupied. He mentioned buying property in Hastings to move the library to, and asked the Board for consensus to allow the County Real Estate Department to bid for land on foreclosed property, on Main Street in Hastings, at the cost of about \$175,000. Discussion ensued on alternatives, regarding a mobile facility, and putting together a package for the Board to review.

(10:52 a.m.) Wanchick said the current Hastings Library building, with the constant cost of repairs, was too expensive to reside in. He said staff would like to do an analysis of the proposal presented by Sanchez, and bring the information back to the Board for consideration. Discussion ensued on a site for the Hastings Library building. (10:57 a.m.) *There was consensus of the Board to research property for the Hastings Library.*

The regular meeting recessed at 10:58 a.m. for a break, and then moved to the Special Meeting at 11:00 a.m.

(11:38 a.m.) Morris reconvened the regular meeting.

(11:38 a.m.) Commissioner McClure:

McClure mentioned attending the COL. Ed Taylor dedication for the Veterans Nursing Home, and the School Board meeting, in which a presentation was given regarding the effectiveness of their green schools.

McClure said it was FCAT season, and wished the students good luck.

McClure said thanks to WWII Veterans and the Enterprise Women League for allowing the Board to make the proclamations.

McClure mentioned a meeting at the Whitney Lab concerning economic development through environmental needs, scheduled for Tuesday, March 6, 2013, at 7:00 p.m.

(11:41 a.m.) Commissioner Stevenson:

Stevenson spoke about how important the International Women's Day, and the WWII Veterans proclamation were.

Stevenson said in recent weeks there were extraordinary retirements, and significant contributors in the community honored.

Stevenson spoke about St. Johns County being one of the healthiest communities in the country, and would like to be briefed on positions of all the Directors retiring in 2013.

Stevenson mentioned, in the Cultural Resource Review Board meeting, a young 4H guy had proposed clean-up projects in the San Sebastian and Pine Hurst cemetery. Stevenson said there would be a letter forth coming requesting the Board's assistance on the issue.

Stevenson said that she would like to get a report on the train project contracts regarding energy efficiency for the County.

Commissioner Morris:

No report.

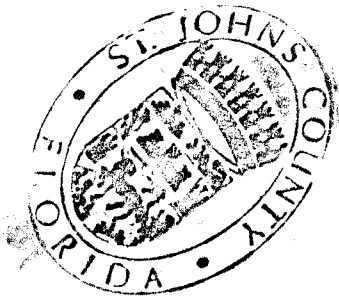
