AUGUSTINE, Fla., January 11, 2024 — The St. Johns County Clerk of the Circuit Court and County Comptroller's Office had the unique opportunity to work with a group of George Washington University (GW) students to create a public information campaign to inform residents about the role of jurors in the legal system.

"As an alum, I'm proud of the GW students' hard work in developing several recommendations in how we can educate and motivate residents to serve as jurors in our county," said Clerk of Courts and County Comptroller, Brandon J. Patty. "The students presented several great ideas for our office to consider. We look forward to exploring those options and are very proud of their work."

"Gaining hands-on experience through a real-life group project is the best way for students to learn about communication," Dr. Wendy Riemann, the Small Group Communication class professor who organized this project said. The clerk's office is already planning the upcoming GWU communication class project for 2024. It will be our office's third year working with the GWU students on ways to better the clerk's office's initiatives.
